Decision

The Department of Highways and Public Works has searched the Deputy Minister's Office, Assistant Deputy Minister - Transportation's Office, Transport Services & Registrar of Motor Vehicles, Carrier Compliance Branch, and Motor Vehicles Branch and has identified records responsive to Access Request 22-674. Access Granted in Full

Please provide all correspondence between Motor Vehicles, YTG legal department, Minister, DM, ADM, Director and Carrier compliance Manager/Staff regarding interpretation of highways act Escort Vehicle driver minimum license requirement/driving experience. This section is found on page 72 of the highways act. It was requested that this section, reading "Valid Class 5 drivers license with at least two years driving experience." be interpreted to determine whether an operator requires a class 5 license for 2 full years, or simply requires a class 5 license and 2 years driving experience (graduated licence experience presumably sufficing) Thanks! Timeframe: February 1, 2020 - February 2, 2023
