

EXPLANATORY NOTE:

- On April 1, 2021 a new Access to Information and Protection of Privacy (ATIPP) Act came into force in the Yukon. Request numbers with the format 21-XXX were processed under the new ATIPP Act. - Summaries have been provided for requests for non-personal information. Where personal information was requested, the applicant's personal information has been protected by limiting the summary to "Personal Information Request."
- Request Status provides information on disclosure decision. Granted Full means all responsive information was provided. Granted Part means that some of the responsive information was redacted. Refused means that none of the responsive information was provided. No Records means that no responsive records were found. Abandoned means that the applicant did not follow-up by paying prescribed costs and the request was closed. Withdrawn means that the applicant choose to withdraw and the request was closed.
- Reasons for Extension provides the sections of the respective ATIPP Acts that the extension was granted under.
- Under the new Act extensions are granted in business days.
- Exemptions Applied lists the sections of the respective ATIPP Acts that support any redaction made.
- # Pages is the volume of pages for each request provided to the applicant.
- Appeal(s) to the IPC (Information and Privacy Commissioner) can either be done through an informal consultation process as per section 93 of the ATIPP Act or as formal investigations as per section 94 of the Act.
- Tourism and Culture does not keep information on the type of applicant making requests or on the sensitivity of requests.
