Redactions Summary	
Code 70(1)	Third Party Personal Information – Names, and third party personal opinion would be an unreasonable invasion of a third party's privacy.

Code 77(1)(a)	Disclosure of the information could be reasonably expected to result in undue financial loss or gain to the museum.

Notes:

As noted on the Access to Information Summary provided, the Department of Tourism and Culture did not provide funding for the Mountain Music festival and therefore did not have any records to provide regarding the event report.

A consultation was conducted with the MacBride Museum related to their Application for funding and much of the information was withheld as recommended from the museum. The reasoning provided is: the information is intellectual property belonging to the museum and that disclosure would be disadvantageous to the business in terms of competitiveness and future negotiating.
