I acknowledge the SLU hasn't officially existed since the 2019 reforms, but I am interested in any records that may still mention it (i.e. I am assuming there may be records referencing "the former SLU"). Let me know if the department requires further clarification.

I'd like to narrow my request to only include records found within the corrections branch.

Seven pages fell outside the specified timeframe which resulted in only three pages being provided in the final response.
