## MacBride Museum receives \$6 million to construct new building in downtown Whitehorse

Joint news release

WHITEHORSE—The Honourable Mélanie Joly, Minister of Canadian Heritage, along with the Honourable Larry Bagnell, Member of Parliament (Yukon), and the Honourable Darrell Pasloski, Premier of Yukon, today announced funding for the MacBride Museum of Yukon History to construct a new 19,000-square-foot building in downtown Whitehorse.

The museum's newest addition will house four exhibition galleries, each focusing on a different element of Yukon's industrial history. A fifth gallery will house Engine 51, one of the first locomotives on the White Pass & Yukon Route railway. The Engine 51 gallery will be the centrepiece of the museum's new building.

This addition will enable the museum to create and display new exhibitions, improve and increase permanent exhibition space, and protect an existing heritage structure.

The Government of Canada is providing \$3,000,000 in funding for the expansion of the museum through the Canada Cultural Spaces Fund. The Government of Yukon is also providing \$3,000,000 toward this exciting initiative.

## **Quick Facts**

- The MacBride Museum of Yukon History, established in 1951, is dedicated to telling Yukon's natural, social, economic and industrial history, with a focus on the role of Whitehorse.
- More than 30,000 artifacts, including photographs, documents and objects, are housed in the MacBride Museum. Nearly 25,000 visitors attend the museum each year.
- The Government of Canada's cultural infrastructure program is the Department of Canadian Heritage's Canada Cultural Spaces Fund. The fund supports the improvement of physical conditions for artistic creativity and innovation, as well as the improvement, renovation and construction of arts and heritage facilities, and the acquisition of specialized equipment.
- In February 2016, the Honourable Elaine Taylor, Deputy Premier of Yukon and Minister of Tourism and Culture, announced a contribution of \$450,000 to assist with the planning and design of an expansion to the museum.
