STATEMENT OF POLICY

This policy describes the procedure to be followed if a perimeter of the correctional centre is breached.

AUTHORITIES

Corrections Act, 2009: ss. 2, 14, 15

DEFINITIONS

Perimeter breach: a planned or unplanned breach in the security of either the correctional centre's secure perimeter or threat perimeter.

Secure perimeter: the physical outer wall of the correctional centre, within which inmates may move without escort.

Threat perimeter: the outer level of security, typically a secure fence, that inmates or persons from outside the correctional centre may reach without challenge.
