First northern lights flight in Canada to take off from Whitehorse

Air North, the Yukon Astronomical Society and the Government of Yukon are partnering to bring a once-in-a-lifetime opportunity to see the northern lights (aurora borealis) from a private, chartered flight.

The high-altitude northern lights experience will take off from Whitehorse on November 24 or 25, weather dependent. The Air North flight will offer 78 seats and the cabin will feature dimmed lighting and other amenities designed to enhance the aurora viewing experience, which is the first of its kind in North America.

After the flight, passengers will receive a certificate from the Royal Astronomical Society and Air North stating they crossed the Arctic Circle during their northern lights flight.

The flight packages range from \$950 to \$1,975 and cover just the flight or a combination of the flight and hotel stays and transportation. Tickets go on sale later this month through Air North.
