



International overnight visitation (1+ nights)*


In 2020, overnight visitation for international visitors was 82% lower than in 2019.

The month of June saw a decrease of 94% in overnight visitation compared to the 5-year average (2015-2019).

International overnight visitation in 2020 was 86% lower than the 5-year average.




Air arrivals at Erik Nielsen Whitehorse International Airport

In 2020, air arrivals fell 78% or 161,300 fewer passengers than in 2019.

Compared to 5 years ago, air arrivals in 2020 fell by 74% or 124,600 fewer passengers than in 2016.

Occupancy at select fixed roof accommodations "


Yukon's occupancy rate was 35.2% in 2020, 27.5 points lower than in 2019.

In 2020, Yukon's occupancy rates were 1.6 points higher than national rates (33.6%).

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International border crossings (into Yukon)


Overall, international border crossings in 2020 were 94% lower than in 2019.

The month of June saw a 98% decrease compared to 2019.

Crossings through Canadian Border Services Agency ports of entry were 93% lower than the 5-year average (2015-2019).

Same day international border crossings (into Yukon)*


Same day border crossings in 2020 were 98% lower than in 2019.

The months of May through September each saw a 99% decrease in same day border crossings compared to the same months one year earlier.


Retail sales (\$000)

Retail sales in 2020 were up 2% (\$19.7 million) over 2019.

Nationally, retail sales decreased 2% compared to 2019.

In 2020, retail sales in Yukon were up 12% compared to the 5-year average (2015-2019).
