### Yukon artists receive funding for sound recordings

WHITEHORSE—The Yukon government's Yukon Film & Sound Commission is awarding \$23,000 to seven Yukon sound recording professionals through the Yukon Sound Recording Program.

"We continue to highlight our talented artists through support from the Film & Sound Commission," Economic Development Minister Steve Nordick said. "Yukon musicians continue to garner success and we are proud to support them to produce albums and demo recordings in order to further their careers."

David Haddock is one of the successful recipients receiving \$5,000 to produce a full-length recording.

"This was my first time applying to the Film & Sound Commission's sound recording fund and I found the people extremely helpful and the application very easy to complete," Haddock said. "I will use the funds to finish my third album this fall."

Whitehorse songwriter and performer Fawn Fritzen, was awarded \$2,000 to produce a demo recording.

"I'm thrilled to receive funding for this demo as it will enable me to book gigs to play at various festivals and venues," Fritzen said. "In late July, I will be recording three jazz tracks for the demo including one original."

The Yukon Sound Recording Program is available to assist with the cost of professional sound and demo recordings. The grants are awarded twice a year with application deadlines of May 1 and November 1.
