Arena addition and increased health ambition projects receive CDF Tier 3 funding

WHITEHORSE—Yukon's Community Development Fund (CDF) continues to promote projects that provide social and economic benefits to Yukoners by awarding eight recipients with a total of \$1.2 million in Tier 3 funding.

"In this intake, we have awarded over \$1 million to organizations throughout the territory," Economic Development Minister Steve Nordick said. "CDF supports a wide range of events, organizations and communities, ensuring the continued growth and promotion of valuable programs and projects across Yukon."

The Village of Haines Junction is receiving \$200,000 to build four new change rooms with bathrooms, showers and an access corridor to the existing arena.

"CDF has enabled us to address a long-time issue of having too few dressing rooms," Haines Junction Chief Administrative Officer Michael Riseborough said. "Four new dressing rooms will allow us to better accommodate both visiting and gender-specific teams."

Kwanlin Dun First Nation was another successful applicant, receiving \$100,000 to plan and develop a sustainable, broad-based, culturally appropriate Community Recreation Program for Kwanlin Dun and surrounding neighborhoods.

"CDF funding will enable us to improve the mental, emotional and spiritual health and wellness of our First Nation by focusing on activities that allow our culture to come through," Kwanlin Dun First Nation Director of Health Carmen Gibbons said. "The group at CDF has been extremely helpful throughout the application process and we value their engaging approach to our relationship."

The Community Development Fund offers three funding levels. Tier 1 is available for requests up to \$20,000. Tier 2 is available for applicants requesting \$20,001 to \$75,000, and Tier 3 is available for requests over \$75,000.

The next intake deadline is Friday, July 15 for Tier 1 applications. Organizations are strongly encouraged to contact Community Development Advisors well before the deadlines for assistance with their applications and to develop project ideas. Klondike Snowmobile Association - \$125,000 Wolf Creek Bridge – The Klondike Snowmobile Association will install a free span engineered bridge across Wolf Creek on the Copper Haul Road multi-use recreational trail. Kwanlin Dun First Nation - \$100,000 Kwanlin Dun Comes Alive Through Recreation – Kwanlin Dun will plan and develop a sustainable, broad-based culturally appropriate Community Recreation Program for Kwanlin Dun and surrounding neighborhoods, with year one dedicated to the strategic planning and implementing, operationalizing and evaluating specific priority pilot programs.
