Education Week celebrations taking place across Yukon

WHITEHORSE—The importance of lifelong learning and its ability to enrich our lives will be highlighted as the territory celebrates Education Week from April 11 to 15.

"This is an excellent opportunity for Yukoners to gather in each community to explore learning and find out more about the educational opportunities available to them, all while having fun," Education Minister Patrick Rouble said. "This year's theme is *Enriching Lives Through Learning*, which underscores just how much an impact education has on our lives."

The annual week-long event serves to raise awareness about the importance of education as well as the educational opportunities available to Yukoners. It features events across the territory hosted by organizations with an interest in education including schools, Yukon College, First Nations and non-governmental organizations.

Over the course of the week there will be over 30 events including a Na-Cho Nyäk Dunsponsored traditional lunch in Mayo, Ukrainian egg decorating workshops in Watson Lake, a week-long community trivia challenge in Carcross and a beading, drumming and singing workshop in Whitehorse.

The Department of Education will once again host an open house featuring schematic design drawings of the new F.H. Collins Secondary School, LEGO® physics lessons, web conferencing demonstrations and displays and information from numerous community partners.

The nature of interventions and intensity may be decided by teachers individually or in collaboration with school-based teams, always on the basis of evidence that is derived from monitoring student achievement.

An overview of the Labour Market Framework for Yukon: where we have come from; where we are now; where we are going.

#### Thursday: Paula Thompson - Moose Mathematics
