



# Activity Report on the Administration of the **ATIPP Act**

April 1, 2020, to March 31, 2021



# A note from the Deputy Minister of highways and Public Works

I am pleased to present the 2020-2021 annual report outlining activities related to the administration of the *Access to Information and Protection of Privacy (ATIPP)* Act.

During 2020-2021, public bodies received a total of 526 requests for program and personal information. This number represents roughly a 2% decrease from the 537 requests received in 2019-2020. 101 requests were carried over into the 2020-2021 fiscal year.

2020-2021 saw 27% of all requests completed being for personal information, with 73% of requests being for program information.

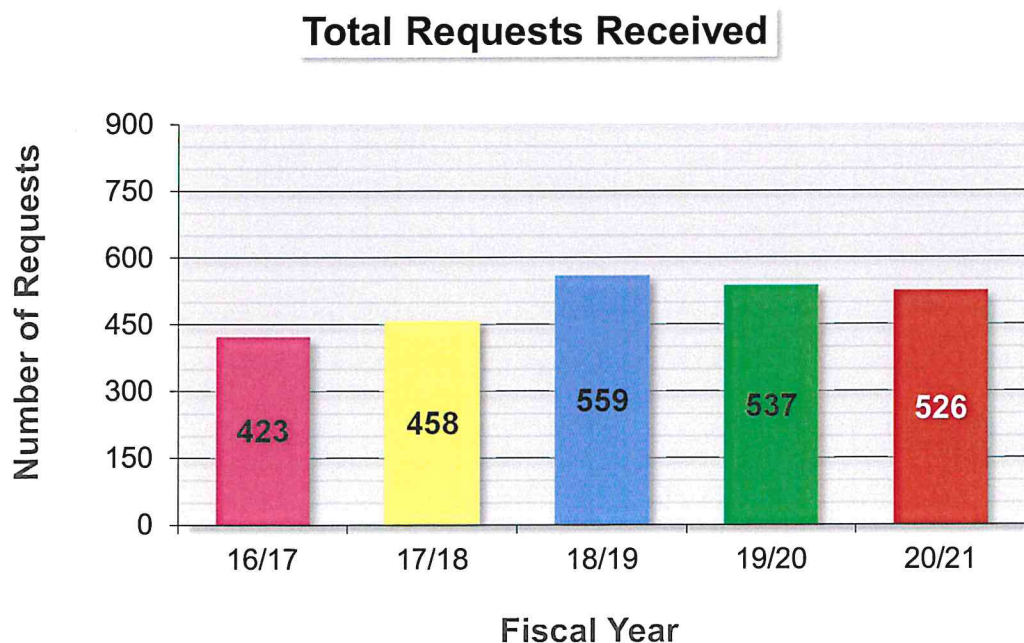


## Statistics on Access to Information

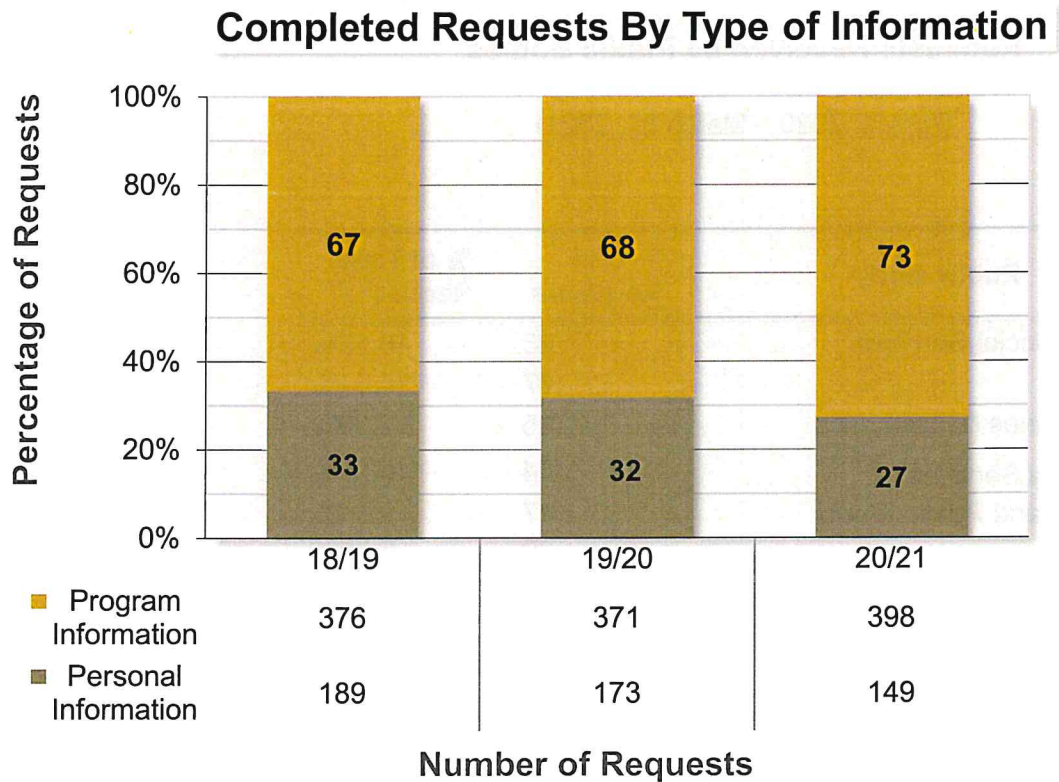

## Total Completed Formal Requests by Type of Information

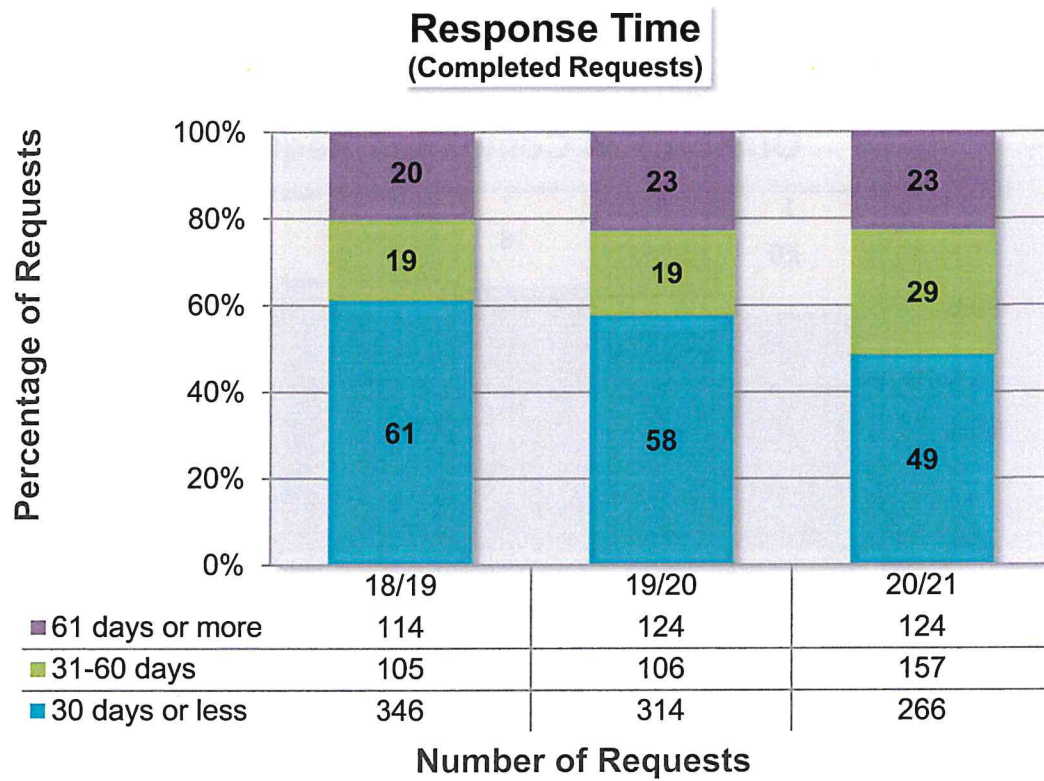

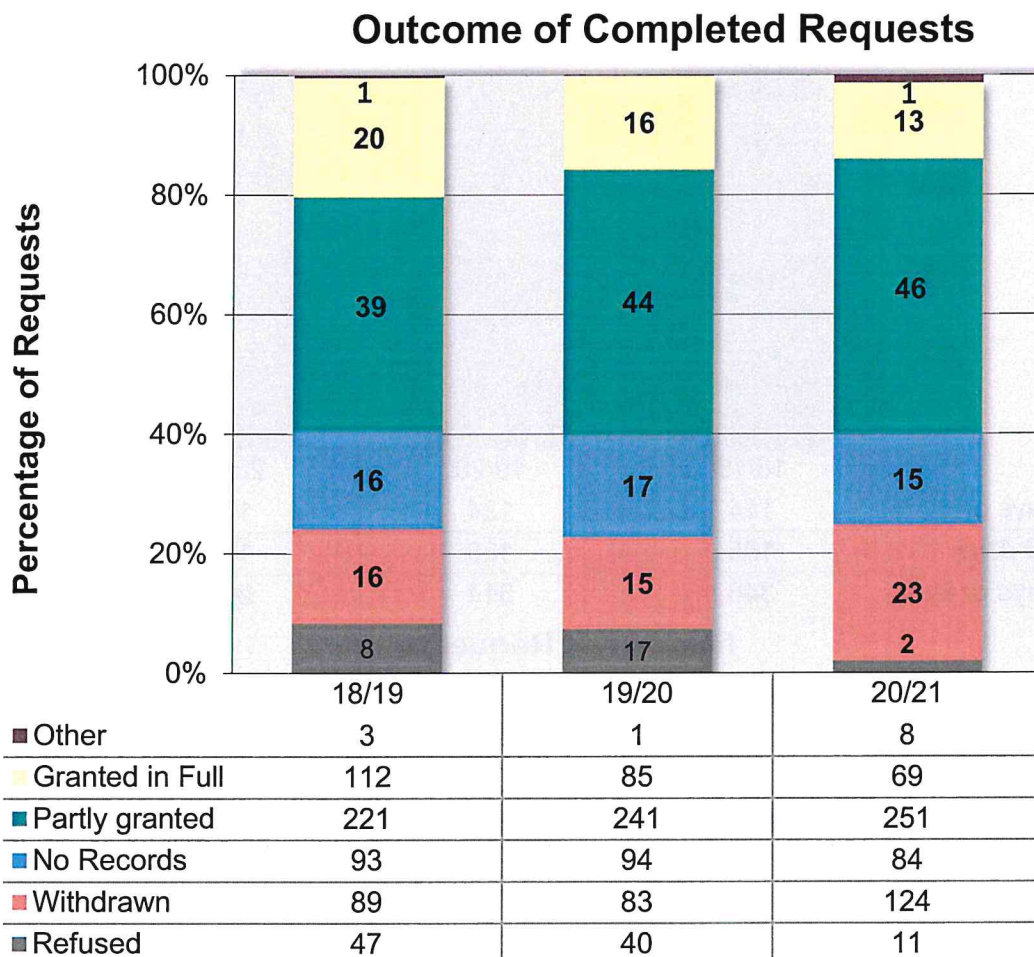
## Response Time of Total Formal Requests Completed
