ELECTION SUMMARY

Writs for by-elections in two electoral districts were issued on January 5, 1996 to fill the vacancies in the Yukon Legislative Assembly. These vacancies were the result of the resignation of Tony Penikett, Member of the Legislative Assembly representing the Electoral District of Whitehorse West, and the death of Johnny Abel, Member of the Legislative Assembly representing the Electoral District of Vuntut Gwich'in.

The Electoral District of Vuntut Gwich'in is the smallest and furthest north, bordering on the Arctic Ocean. All the electors in this electoral district reside in the community of Old Crow. This is the only community in the Yukon which must be reached by air.

The Electoral District of Whitehorse West is located in the City of Whitehorse and consists of suburban areas and small neighbourhoods.

Enumeration took place in both electoral districts following the issue of the writs just before record-low temperatures and a lengthy cold period forced cancellation of commercial air and road travel in the northern half of the Yukon and had candidates campaigning door-to-door in extreme conditions.

The Electoral District of Whitehorse West had experienced substantial growth since the 1992 general election, particularly the area which was polling division 2. As there were 789 electors enumerated in this polling division, it was split in half and two polling stations were established for polling day.

Advance polls were held in the two electoral districts on Sunday, January 28 and Monday, January 29, 1996. Sixty-one electors voted before polling day.

On polling day, Monday, February 5,1996, 1,118 electors voted in the two electoral districts under sunny and milder conditions. Judicial recounts were not required. The results of the by-elections were declared on February 19, 1996.


