DEPARTMENTAL OBJECTIVE

- To ensure that the renewable resources and the environment of the Yukon are managed and used in accordance with government policy by:
 - maintaining and enhancing the quality of Yukon's environment for present and future generations through ecosystem-based management, conservation of resources and protection and maintenance of biodiversity;
 - developing and implementing a protected areas strategy, and implementing the principles of the Yukon Conservation Strategy;
 - ensuring that Yukon people have the opportunity to be involved in the development and review of departmental programs, policies, legislation and regulations through open and effective communication and processes:
 - managing renewable resources in a manner that promotes integration with other sectors such as economic development, so that optimum benefits can be derived for all Yukon people;
 - participating in national and international measures designed to enhance environmental quality and encourage sustainable use of renewable resources;
 - integrating, implementing and managing additional authorities and responsibilities in areas of renewable resources and environmental management as they are devolved from the Federal Government, that are consistent with the Government of Yukon's policy and constitutional objectives; and
 - undertaking resource management activities that meet the Government of Yukon obligations and respect the rights of aboriginal people and relationships established through land claim and self-government agreements.
