PROTECTIVE SERVICES Emergency Medical Services Ambulance Services

SUPPLEMENTARY INFORMATION

Yukon Emergency Medical Services provide emergency medical transportation for residents and non-residents throughout the territory. In Whitehorse, the ambulance stations are staffed 24 hours a day by ground and air ambulance practitioners. In communities, services are provided by on-call volunteers supported by two, full-time Primary Care Paramedics that offer weekday coverage in Dawson City and Watson Lake. Each community provides its volunteers and Yukon government provides the facilities, ambulances, equipment and training.
