- <sup>(3)</sup> This number remains relatively static because generally, whenever a title is issued, the previous title is cancelled. The actual number of active titles will change as new subdivisions and condominium developments are created.
- <sup>(4)</sup> The Yukon Land Titles Registry online search portal opened to the public on December 1, 2021. Since then customers have been able to obtain title searches, General Register Certificates and other information online.

#### SUPPLEMENTARY INFORMATION

- Yukon Community Corrections administers community based corrections programs and services. These programs and services enable the courts to consider a range of alternatives to imprisonment in the sentencing process. They are designed primarily for medium and high risk offenders and based on the characteristics, traits, problems or issues of an individual that directly relate to the individual's likelihood to reoffend and commit another crime.

#### SUPPLEMENTARY INFORMATION

- The Whitehorse Correctional Centre is a multi-level security facility for adult men and women. The centre accommodates inmates serving sentences of less than two years, individuals remanded to custody pending judicial interim release, parole violations, immigration holds, and people who are found not criminally responsible (by order of the Yukon Review Board).

These reports identify all offences contained within each occurrence, i.e. one call for service may generate more than one offence (example: an Assault complaint can also generates a Fail to Comply with Probation Order charge).
