How is equity related to palliative care?

Health Equity impacts Yukoners in all stages of illness

In their 2023 report Access to Palliative Care in Canada, the Canadian Institute for Health Information asserted that while they do not collect all the data themselves, research has shown that characteristics such as race, religion and language impact access to palliative care in Canada.¹ The report also identifies other barriers such as being from a First Nation community, being a new immigrant to Canada or experiencing homelessness.

Findings from The Canadian Pain Task Force Report - *Chronic Pain in Canada: Laying a Foundation for Action*, compound the problem as there is significant overlap in barriers in access to palliative care and increased symptom burden. Their report states; "The burden of chronic pain is not shared equally among Canadians. It is more common among older adults, females, Indigenous Peoples, Veterans, and populations affected by social inequities and discrimination".²

The Palliative Care Resource Team (PCRT) aims to support Yukon health care providers in their efforts to decrease barriers to palliative care. The PCRT has collected tools and resources that may support Yukon health care providers (HCPs) working to identify and potentially address access and equity in their roles and organizations.

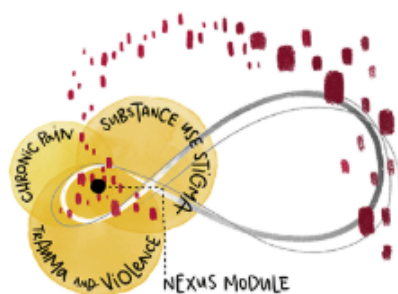


Explore Tools and Resources from EQUIP Health

The Nexus module which is a freely available online and can be taken stand alone or as part of a three course series.



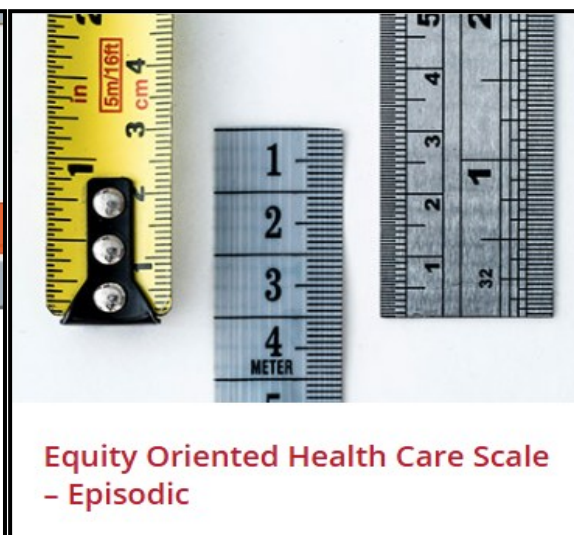
Nexus Module - EQUIP Health Care
