

Wildland Fire responding to the Jeckell Creek fire (DA-001)

June 15, 2025



Update June 17, 2025 5:15 pm: The Jeckell Creek fire (DA-001) showed minimal fire activity today as well, allowing our crews to make more progress on it. With limited heat, several hotspots were extinguished.

As of 5:15 pm Tuesday, the fire is approximately 80 hectares and still out of control. No values are currently threatened.

A lightning-caused wildfire is burning approximately 20 km northeast of Rock Creek.

The Jeckell Creek fire (DA-001) was identified on Sunday, June 15, around 4 pm. The fire is in the transitional zone and is currently out of control. One crew and one helicopter are responding. An Alaskan

airtanker from Fairbanks assisted in a retardant drop on the west side of the fire. The Yukon airtanker group is now working on the fire.

As of 9 pm Sunday, the fire is approximately 75 hectares. No values are currently threatened.

Fire retardant is holding the west flank. The fire is not expected to impact the Dempster Highway at this time.
