

Rain in central Yukon helps reduce fire activity

July 15, 2025



Wildland Fire crews continue to make progress on several wildfires in the Dawson and Mayo regions. With the recent rainfall, the fire activity has been low to minimal, allowing crews to focus on suppression, containment and patrol operations.

As of July 15, all evacuation orders have been rescinded. Updates for fires of note in all regions will now be provided when the status of the fire changes or when tactics change, rather than daily updates.

Four fires of note remain in Dawson. The Rabbit Creek fire (DA-007) is 12,384 hectares and remains out of control. The Sulphur Creek fire (DA-025) is estimated to be 772 hectares and is also out of control. The Quebec Creek fire (DA-012) and the Mount Leotta fire (DA-016) have changed status to being held.

Three fires of note remain in Mayo. The North Ferry Hill (MA-006) is approximately 13,000 hectares and remains out of control. The Francis Plateau fire (MA-019) and the Ladue Lake fire (MA-022) also remain out of control, estimated to be 1,200 hectares and 5,500 hectares, respectively.

Although the fires of note are showing reduced activity due to current conditions, they remain under close observation. Internal smoke may continue to be visible. Wildfire crews are well-positioned to respond if conditions change.
