Yukon's Arts Fund strengthens community spirit

WHITEHORSE—The Yukon government's Arts Fund will provide \$226,043 to 17 groups in support of art development and programming.

"A vibrant and diverse arts and culture community enriches life for all Yukoners," Tourism and Culture Minister Mike Nixon said. "Through the Arts Fund the Yukon government can support groups and artistic endeavors that strengthen community spirit and cultural pride."

The Adäka Cultural Society will receive \$35,000 for the Adäka Cultural Festival that will take place in June 2012.

"Funding from Arts Fund continues to help build the Adäka Cultural Festival into a world-class, iconic event that showcases, celebrates and fosters the development of Yukon's diverse and distinctive First Nations arts and culture," co-executive producer Katie Johnson said. "Opportunities like Adäka are critical for healthy and culturally vibrant Yukon communities."

MusicYukon will receive \$23,575 for the Arts in the Park programming that takes place throughout the summer months in LePage Park.

"We're thrilled to receive this support," MusicYukon executive director Lynne Cavanagh said. "The visual and performing artists who give of their time, energy and creative expression are an important part of the vibrant cultural scene in downtown Whitehorse. With the help of the Arts Fund, we look forward to another great summer of Arts in the Park beginning in May."

The Arts Fund supports community group projects that advance the development of the arts in Yukon. Projects are reviewed by the Yukon Arts Advisory Council, which advises the minister on recommendations for funding.

For a list of council members visit the Yukon Arts Advisory Council website. Members are appointed by the Tourism and Culture Minister, and serve three year terms or can be re-appointed for successive terms. The next Arts Fund application deadline is June 15.
