## Community Development Fund invests in the future, commemorates the past

WHITEHORSE—A variety of community organizations are receiving over \$400,000 in funding from the Community Development Fund (CDF) to support training and educational initiatives and enhance recreational facilities across Yukon.

"The CDF is an important part of improving quality of life for Yukoners," Economic Development Minister Currie Dixon said. "Projects like Yukon Women in Mining and the Tr'ondëk Hwëch'in job fair provide opportunities for all Yukoners to participate in our strong economy."

Bringing Youth Towards Equality (B.Y.T.E.) received \$58,567 to deliver a leadership training workshop to two youth from each community in Yukon.

"This is a new project that could not have happened without support from the CDF," Community Outreach Coordinator Tanyss Knowles said. "The Leaders-in-Training workshop builds on the programming we already deliver in rural communities and will allow for a more sustainable relationship between B.Y.T.E. and youth in communities throughout Yukon."

The Council of Yukon First Nations (CYFN) received \$20,000 to assist in recognizing the 40th Anniversary of the historic document *Together Today for our Children Tomorrow*.

"CYFN is very excited to receive funding from the Community Development Fund to help celebrate the 40th Anniversary of our land claim process," Grand Chief Ruth Massie said. "This will give us an opportunity to highlight some of our achievements by First Nation governments as well as individuals who have supported this process."

The Community Development Fund offers three levels of financial support for Yukon organizations and municipal and First Nations governments. Tier 1 funding is available for requests up to \$20,000. Tier 2 funding is available for applicants requesting \$20,001 to \$75,000 and Tier 3 funding is available for requests over \$75,000. The next intake deadline is January 15 for Tier 1 and 3 applications.

Applicants are encouraged to contact a community development adviser well in advance of deadlines for help with developing project ideas and submitting applications.
