Yukon performers and snow carvers to be showcased at Ottawa celebration

WHITEHORSE—Eleven Yukon performers and artists will be heading to Ottawa, Canada's Capital, for Yukon Days at Winterlude February 8 to 11, 2013.

"The Yukon government is proud to support the artists performing at Winterlude," Premier Darrell Pasloski said. "Being part of the Capital's Winterlude celebrations showcases Yukon talent and creativity to Canada and the world."

Hip-hop dance group Infinite Movement, clown and musician Claire Ness and MC and producer Kelvin Smoler will work together to create an interactive, family-friendly series of shows at Jacques Cartier Park February 9 and 10. The group will also collaborate to create a high energy show for the first ever Yukon Night Dance Party at Ottawa City Hall.

In addition, the Team Canada Yukon snow carvers will once again be at the festival, carving their interpretation of this year's theme: the Yukon Quest International Sled Dog Race 30th Anniversary.

"The focus on the Yukon Quest 30th anniversary will raise the profile of this iconic winter event to thousands of Canadians," Tourism and Culture Minister Mike Nixon said. "Winterlude is also a great opportunity to increase awareness of the many cultural festivals and sporting events held in the territory throughout the year."

Winterlude visitors will be able to learn more about Yukon through an interpretive panel in front of the snow carving, by interacting with the performers during workshops or by visiting www.gov.yk.ca/yukondays.html.

"The Government of Canada is delighted to highlight Yukon Days as part of Winterlude, organized by the National Capital Commission," Member of Parliament for Yukon Ryan Leef said. "Winterlude is the perfect setting to showcase the great talent that comes from the territory as Yukon Days continues to grow and become a tradition at these Canadian winter celebrations."

Yukon has participated in the Winterlude festival since 2008. A diverse range of Yukon artists, performers and snow sculptors have been showcased each year and are ambassadors to the hundreds of thousands of people at the festival.

"The National Capital Commission is pleased to feature artists from Yukon as part of Winterlude for a fifth consecutive year," Chief Executive Officer Jean-François Trépanier said. "Winterlude is synonymous with winter in the Capital, and with events such as Yukon Days, it will continue to grow and enhance the Capital's vibrancy."
