Arts Fund assists Yukon community projects

WHITEHORSE – The Department of Tourism and Culture is pleased to allocate \$228,650 to 16 community organizations in support of arts development and programming.

"As was demonstrated by artists and audiences at the Vancouver 2010 Winter Olympics, the arts promote great pride in Yukoners by helping define who we are and celebrating where we come from," Tourism and Culture Minister Elaine Taylor said. "Through the Arts Fund and other programs, the Yukon government is pleased to continue to invest in projects that engage people, animate communities and build capacity."

The Fiddle Kids Organization is one group benefiting from the Arts Fund. In a multi-disciplinary project involving four elements, the Organization will be offering a music camp; touring the Fiddleheads to Yukon venues; creating a theatrical production for 2010; and preparing another theatrical production for 2011.

"We are thrilled to get support from the Arts Fund," Fiddle Kids Organization director Bob Kuiper said. "This funding will allow us to expand our programs to develop artistic skills in music, fiddling, dance, performance and theatre. We will especially be reaching out to youth, and will be welcoming all members of the community to join in and participate."

Other initiatives funded include workshops and artist demonstrations at the seventh annual Sheep and Crane Festival in Faro; staging the 20th Moosehide Gathering celebrations; and a youth forum hosted by Breakdancing Yukon Society.

The Arts Fund is an application-driven program for group projects that foster the development of the arts in Yukon. Applications are accepted four times a year and are assessed by the Yukon Arts Advisory Council. The Department of Tourism and Culture contributes more than \$2.7 million annually in support of arts and culture.
