Government hosting opioid management conference

The Government of Yukon is hosting a conference on May 31 and June 1 called Preventing and Managing Opioid Addiction/Misuse Through Innovative Models of Care.

The two-day conference will provide Yukon health care providers and policy makers with an opportunity to learn about harm reduction in action, and the role of culture and community in recovery. Participants will explore community-based models of care that better support Yukoners struggling with addictions or pain. Finally, the conference will highlight evidence and current guidelines for opioid prescribing.

The event is an initiative of Yukon Chief Medical Officer of Health Dr. Brendan Hanley, with support from the Mental Wellness Strategy team from the Government of Yukon's Department of Health and Social Services, and in collaboration with multiple community partners.
