Yukon government employees moving back into the Lynn Building

A detailed investigation of the Lynn Building has determined that the seismic activity on May 1 did not damage the structural integrity of the building and that is it safe to reoccupy.

The building underwent three assessments — two visual inspections followed by a third one that further investigated the underlying structure behind the walls in locations where exterior cracking in the stucco and drywall finishes appeared.

Staff from the Government of Yukon's Department of Community Services will be moving back into the building this week, except for the Property Assessment and Taxation office as noted below. Operations are expected to be back to normal within a couple of days.

All necessary repairs to the building have been completed.
