Yukoners invited to explore their Yukon in month-long tourism campaign

The 2017 Explore Your Yukon tourism campaign is taking place May 18 to June 18. To kick off the summer tourism season, Yukoners are encouraged to explore businesses and attractions throughout the territory.

This year, Yukoners will have an entire month to visit more than 60 participating businesses, historic sites, museums and First Nation cultural centres in 13 communities. Each venue is offering special incentives to Yukoners, and the opportunity to enter coupons to win one of four grand prizes. Visitors also qualify for eligible incentives and for the grand prize draw.
