Federal government announces significant increase in support for French language services in the territories

Member of Parliament for Yukon Larry Bagnell today announced major funding for Francophone communities in Yukon, the Northwest Territories and Nunavut. Mr. Bagnell made the announcement on behalf of the Minister of Canadian Heritage Mélanie Joly.

For more than three decades, the Government of Canada has supported the implementation of territorial legislation for services in French. In late 2016–17, the Government of Canada signed agreements with each of the territorial partners that significantly expand federal financial support for French language services delivered by the territories. This will allow the territories to more fully meet their official-language obligations.

These agreements will enable members of the Franco-Yukonnais, Franco-Ténois, and Franco-Nunavois communities to benefit from improved access to territorial services in French.
