## National Aboriginal Day becomes a statutory holiday in Yukon

Today, the Government of Yukon's Bill 2 to amend the *Employment Standards Act* was passed after third reading of the *National Aboriginal Day Act* and assented to by the Commissioner of Yukon Doug Phillips.

The legislation creates National Aboriginal Day as an annual statutory holiday in Yukon beginning on June 21, 2017.
