Arts funding supports tours, celebrations and the creation of new works

Thirteen projects are sharing a total of \$163,520 in arts funding in this year's spring intake of applications.

The Arts Fund is supporting 10 arts projects taking place in Whitehorse and Yukon communities. Several of the projects will result in the creation of new theatre, visual arts and dance works. The Touring Artist Fund is assisting three Yukon music and theatre projects to tour in North America.

- There are four application intakes each year for both funds on the 15th of March, June, September and December.
- Applications are adjudicated by the Yukon Arts Advisory Council. Members are appointed by the minister to represent arts disciplines, Yukon communities and the distinct interests of First Nation artists.
