Alternative emergency shelter slated to open

A partnership between the Government of Yukon and Kwanlin Dün First Nation will add 10 beds to Whitehorse's emergency shelter capacity.

Located in the former St. Elias group home on Fifth Avenue, the shelter is scheduled to open February 3. The temporary shelter will be managed and operated by the Kwanlin Dün Health Centre. It will be open 12 hours a day and will supplement current existing shelter beds in Whitehorse.

The Yukon government is providing \$90,000 in funding to the Kwanlin Dün First Nation for the temporary shelter. The Kwanlin Dün First Nation's Elders Emergency Fund is also contributing \$5,000 to the project. Government of Yukon's Department of Health and Social Services is providing the building.

The project supports the principles of the Housing Action Plan for Yukon.

Quick facts

- The shelter will operate until April 30, 2017 as a temporary measure to address a bed shortage. The building will be demolished this summer as planned.
- Additional shelter will become available when the new Salvation Army Centre of Hope opens, which will increase the number of temporary shelter beds from 14 to 25.
- The vulnerable people at risk initiative is a partnership between the Kwanlin Dün First Nation, the Ta'an Kwäch'än Council, the City of Whitehorse and the Government of Yukon. It also involves community partners from non-government organizations and businesses, as well as individuals with lived experience.
