Yukon athletes headed to Toronto for North American Indigenous Games

Team Yukon is excited to compete in the 2017 North American Indigenous Games taking place in Toronto from July 16 to 23. With over 130 athletes, Yukon is sending one of its largest teams ever to participate in 12 events, including athletics, archery, canoe and wrestling. This year's games will focus on the significance of the Truth and Reconciliation Commission's Action #88, which calls on governments to ensure long-term Indigenous athletic development through support of these games.

The Government of Yukon and the Yukon Aboriginal Sport Circle are holding a pep rally tonight at 6:30 to celebrate Team Yukon's participation in the Games. Athletes, mission staff, coaches and support staff will march along the waterfront to the fire pit at the Kwanlin Dün Cultural Centre.
