Community Development Fund supports Ross River community projects

The Government of Yukon has approved nearly \$700,000 towards 18 community projects through Community Development Fund Tier 2 funding. The projects will provide employment opportunities for at least 66 people as well as a number of local contractors.

Funding will contribute to new infrastructure, event hosting, job training and the development of useable skills for community residents.

Recipients include the Ross River Dena Council, which was awarded \$38,391 to expand their current playground with outdoor toddler play structures, such as ride-on spring toys and a two-seated swing set with belt seats. The playground area will be covered with rubberized mulch and a picnic table will be installed on site. The enhanced playground will benefit the community by ensuring toddlers and children have a safe area to play. The project will create 35 hours of employment for three people.

Yukon College's Ross River Campus was awarded \$36,600 to provide a six-week hairdressing basics course. The course consists of the functional techniques and practical business skills necessary to offer hairdressing services in the community. This project has the potential to lead to local and sustainable business opportunities in the community. The project will create 240 hours of employment for one person.

- The Community Development Fund's primary goal is to support projects that provide long-term benefits and value to Yukon communities. The projects are awarded based on merit and the ability to demonstrate social, cultural and economic benefits.
- The Community Development Fund is divided into three tiers with five intake deadlines:
 - Tier I: Applications of \$20,000 or less (intake deadlines in January, May, July and October).
 - Tier 2: Applications of \$20,001 to \$75,000 (intake deadline in May and September).
 - Tier 3: Applications of \$75,001 or more (intake deadline in January).

Background for news release for CDF Tier 2 May 2017 intake approved projects

Kluane Lake Athletic Association – \$5,988 – To replace the leaking asphalt roof that covers the gymnasium, offices and the Post Office in the Destruction Bay Community Centre. This project is also being supported through the Department of Community Services. The project will create 320 hours of employment for two people. Contact: Grace Southwick at (867) 841-4553.

Yukon Amateur Radio Association – \$28,272 – To increase the battery bank size at four key locations in the VHF/UHF radio repeater network by purchasing and installing new batteries. This linked network of mountain-top radio repeater sites supports civil authorities in the provision of radio communications during times of emergency and serves as a communications network during community activities and events. The project will create eight hours of employment for one person and 160 hours of volunteer time for 16 volunteers. Contact: Bob Melanson at (867) 334-6657.

Village of Mayo – \$36,209 – To complete upgrades to the interior of the Binet House Museum and Annex buildings. The Binet House Museum showcases the local history of Mayo and attracts Yukoners and visitors from around the world. The project will create 450 hours of employment for five people. Ross River Dena Council - \$38,391 - To expand their current playground with outdoor toddler play structures such as

ride-on spring toys and a two-seated swing set with belt seats; to cover the playground area with rubberized mulch; and to install a picnic table on site. The enhanced playground will benefit the community by ensuring toddlers/children have a safe area to play. The project will create 35 hours of employment for three people. Yukon Women's Transition Home Society – \$26,374 – To develop a communications strategy and materials and upgrade the website. The project will improve communications to ensure information on all offered services is reflected in its materials and easily accessible online. North Ridge Community Association – \$24,365 – To hire a Project Coordinator who will work with the Musical Ride Host Committee to ensure the successful hosting of the RCMP Musical Ride in Whitehorse on August 12 and 13, 2017. The RCMP Musical Ride is an iconic Canadian event and one of Yukon's premier celebrations for Canada's 150th birthday. The project will create 210 hours of employment for one person. Yukon College (Ross River Campus) – \$36,600 – A six-week hairdressing basics course to gain the functional techniques and practical business skills necessary to offer haircutting, colouring and perming basics in the community. This project is an example of training that can lead to needed local and sustainable business opportunities in the community. The project will create 240 hours of employment for one person.
