Government of Yukon tables Bill to amend the Workers' Compensation Act and the Occupational Health and Safety Act

The Government of Yukon today tabled Bill No. 8, which will amend the *Workers' Compensation Act* and the *Occupational Health and Safety Act* to better support and care for Yukon workers who are most at risk from suffering from Post-Traumatic Stress Disorder (PTSD).

The proposed amendments to the *Workers' Compensation Act* would establish the presumption that a PTSD diagnosis for an emergency response worker is work-related. Emergency response workers include paramedics, firefighters and police officers.

Proposed changes to the *Occupational Health and Safety Act* would permit the Yukon government to introduce regulations to protect the mental health of Yukoners in their workplaces and prevent psychological injuries, such as PTSD, from occurring.

Quick facts

- Most Yukon workers are already covered for many psychological injuries, including PTSD. A presumption will ensure that an
 emergency response worker's PTSD diagnosis will be considered work-related unless it is otherwise shown.
- The definition of paramedic in the bill would include community health nurses who attend ambulance calls and air ambulance medevacs.
- The 'What We Heard' report issued by the Yukon Workers' Compensation Health and Safety Board following a month of public engagement found that over two-thirds of respondents supported amendments to the Occupational Health and Safety Act to promote development of regulations aimed at preventing mental injuries at work.
