Annual recreation gathering builds community capacity

Recreation leaders from across Yukon are in Marsh Lake and Whitehorse for the annual recreation gathering, jointly hosted by the Government of Yukon and the Recreation and Parks Association of Yukon. The gathering is taking place October 10 - 12.

The gathering provides professional development and networking opportunities for recreation practitioners, after-school and youth leaders, volunteer board members and local recreation authorities. Leaders will leave the gathering with the tools they need to support quality recreation and active living opportunities in their communities.

This year, all participants will complete the Yukon First Nations 101 course offered by Yukon College. This course delivers a broader understanding and appreciation for Yukon First Nations history and will help participants improve recreation program delivery.

The results of the 2016 Yukon Healthy Living Study will also be released at the gathering, helping inform community recreation planning and programming.
