# Every Student, Every Day Fund awards \$50,000 to help improve student attendance

Fifteen community-based projects will receive funding for the next school year through the Every Student, Every Day fund for projects to help increase student attendance throughout Yukon.

A total of \$50,000 will be distributed across 15 projects led by Yukon schools, Yukon First Nations, Gadzoosdaa Residence and the Teen Parent Centre.

Every Student, Every Day is led by the Victoria Gold Yukon Student Encouragement Society, a registered charity. The Government of Yukon administers the fund on behalf of the Society and matches up to \$25,000 per year raised by the society for this fund.

A committee of members from the society, the government and the Association of Yukon School Councils, Boards and Committees reviewed the project submissions and selected the successful projects.

### **Quick facts**

- Students who miss 20 days of school each year beginning in Kindergarten miss the equivalent of a full school year (based on 180 days) by the end of Grade 8.
- Students with good attendance in the early years are much more likely to graduate from high school.
- The successful projects were selected from 24 proposals and will be implemented in the 2017-18 school year.
- Every Student, Every Day has raised and distributed over \$235,000 to benefit 50 grassroots student attendance projects since it was
  established in the fall of 2012.
