YUKON TOURISM VISITATION REPORT DECEMBER 2016

The Yukon Tourism Visitation Report is produced monthly and comprises key indicators of tourism, including visitation estimates, border crossings, visits to Visitor Information Centers and airplane passenger volumes.

HIGHLIGHTS

In December 2016:

- Border crossings through Canadian Border Services Agency ports of entry decreased 4% (133 people) over December 2015.
- Air arrivals at Erik Nielson Whitehorse International Airport were up 12% compared to December 2015.

Year-to-date (January to December) 2016:

- Total border crossings were up 2% compared to the same period in 2015.
- Air passengers arriving at Erik Nielson Whitehorse International Airport were up 9% compared to the same period in 2015.





YUKON MONTHLY TOURISM INDICATORS: BORDER CROSSINGS

Provided by Canada Border Services Agency, the data reports the volume of people entering Canada through designated land or air ports of entry. Figures do not include people travelling in commercial vehicles, by train or marine traffic.


- In December 2016, 133 (4%)
 fewer people crossed into Yukon
 through a Canada Border Services Agency (CBSA) port of entry
 than in December 2015.
- Of the total border crossings:
 - 70% (2,317 people) were non -Yukoners; and
 - 30% (1,007 people) were Yukoners.
- Excluding Yukoners, border crossings decreased 4% (96 people) in December 2016 compared to December 2015.

Private vehicles include people in automobiles, cyclists, and pedestrians.

Year-to-Date (January to December) 2016

- Year-to-date, 335,490 people have crossed the border into Yukon, an increase of 2% (7,712 people) over the same period in 2015.
- Excluding Yukoners, border crossings increased 1% over 2015.


December 2016

- Comparing December 2016 to December 2015, increases in border crossings were seen at Beaver Creek, up 2% (31 people).
- Beaver Creek was the busiest border crossing in December 2016, with 45% of all border crossings; however 11% of those were Yukoners.
- Of the total 1.007 Yukoners to cross the border at a land port of entry in December 2016, 72% (724 Yukoners) crossed at Figures include Yukoners. Fraser.




Year-to-date (January to December) 2016

- Year-to-date, excluding Canadians, 263,397 people entered Yukon through CBSA ports of entry. Of those:
 - 59% stayed one day; and
 - 41% stayed one or more nights.
- Of the 108,762 people who entered Yukon for one or more nights, year-to -date:
 - 82% were American; and
 - 18% were from overseas.

YUKON MONTHLY TOURISM INDICATORS: VISITOR INFORMATION CENTERS

Provided by Tourism Yukon, Visitor Services unit, the data reports an estimate of visitation to Yukon Visitor Information Centres (VICs). Depending on the VIC, visitation estimates are calculated using either guestbook signatures (Beaver Creek, Haines Junction, and Watson Lake) or electronic door counters (Whitehorse, Carcross, and Dawson City).


