An estimated 10,100 people visited Yukon in December 2014. This represents an increase of 500 people or 5.0% compared to December 2013.

An estimated 443,300 people visited Yukon from Year to Date 443,300 January to December 2014. This represents a decrease of 9,900 people or -2% compared to the same period last year.


One of the key measures used to estimate total visitation to Yukon was unavailable for the months of October and November. As a result, forecasts were used. Therefore, as updated data becomes available, year-to-date visitation figures will be revised.

The Yukon Visitor Tracking Program (YVTP) is a volumetric model that estimates the number of people that visit Yukon on a monthly basis. The model includes visitors entering Yukon via highway, train, and air; the model does not include Yukon residents.

A total of 3,382 people entered Yukon through Canada Border Services Agency's border crossings in December. This represents an increase of 872 people or +35% compared to December 2013.


A total of 3,382 people entered Yukon through Canada Border Services Agency's border crossings in December. This represents an increase of 872 people or +35% compared to December 2013. Increases were experienced in private vehicles (up 819 or +33%), motorcoaches (up 28 people or +100%) and air (up 25 people or +100%). By origin, increases were experienced by US (up 418 people or +25%), Canada (up 422 people or +53%) and Other foreign travelers (up 32 people or +168%).

Year to Date

Year to date (January to December), a total of 341,707 people entered Yukon through Canada Border Services Agency's border crossings. This represents a decrease of 8,388 people or -2% compared to January to December 2013. Decreases were experienced in private vehicles (down 9,876 people or -5%) and motorcoaches (down 8,314 people or -6%). These decreases were partially offset by increases in air (up 9,802 people or +214%).

Private Vehicle

Increases were experienced in private vehicle (up 819 people or +33%) compared to December 2013. By origin, increases was experienced by US (up 398 people or +23%), Canada (up 401 people, or +50%) and other foreign travelers (up 20 people or +105%).

Private Vehicle: automobile, cycle, and pedestrian.

Motorcoach

Increases were experienced in motorcoach (up 28 people or +100%) compared to December 2013.

By origin, increases were experienced by US and Canada (each up 14 people or +100%).

International Air

Increases were experienced in air (up 25 people or +100%) compared to December 2013. By origin, increases was experienced by US (up 6 people or +100%), Canada (up 7 people, or +100%) and other foreign travelers (up 12 people or +100%).

Sameday Visit

A total of 899 sameday visitors entered Yukon through Canada Border Services Agency's border crossings in December 2014. All of this increase was seen in private vehicles (up 275 people or +44%).

Multiple Night Visit

A total of 1,264 multiple night visitors entered Yukon through Canada Border Services Agency's border crossings in December, an increase of 127 people or 16% compared to December 2013. By origin, increases were experienced by US (up 150 people or +14%) and other foreign visitors (up 25 people or +139%).

Port of Entry—Year to Date

Year to date (January to December), total border crossings were down 8,388 people, or -2%. Decreases were experienced at Beaver Creek (down 2,325 people or -3%), Fraser (down 14,539 people or -6%), Little Gold (down 5,064 people or -29%) and Old Crow airport (down 14 people). These decreases were partially offset by increases at Pleasant (up 3,773 people or +15%), Dawson City airport (up 8,941 people or +3,605%) and Whitehorse airport (up 871 people or +20%).
