An estimated 11,200 people visited Yukon in March 2014. This represents a decrease of 600 people or -5% compared to March 2013.


An estimated 28,600 people visited Yukon from January to March 2014. This represents a decrease of 1,200 people or -4% compared to the same period last year.

The Yukon Visitor Tracking Program (YVTP) is a volumetric model that estimates the number of people that visit Yukon on a monthly basis. The model includes visitors entering Yukon via highway, train, and air; the model does not include Yukon residents.

#### **March Border Crossings**

A total of 6,040 people entered Yukon through Canada Border Services Agency's border crossings in March. This represents a decrease of 171 people or –3% compared to March, 2013.


A total of 6,040 people entered Yukon through Canada Border Services Agency's border crossings in March. This represents a decrease of 171 people or –3% compared to March, 2013. An increase was experienced in air (up 447 people or +657%). Decreases were experienced in private vehicle (down 610 people or -10%) and in motorcoach (down 8 people or –47%). By origin, an increase was experienced by Canada (up 83 people or +3%). Decreases were experienced for US (down 173 people or –6%) and Others (down 81 people or –47%).

#### **Private Vehicle**

Decreases were experienced in private vehicle (down 5,516 people or -10%) compared to March 2013. By origin, decreases were experienced by US (down 158 people or -5%), Canada (down 406 people or -14%) and Others (down 46 people or -34%).

Private Vehicle: automobile, cycle, and pedestrian.

#### Motorcoach

Decreases were experienced in motorcoach (down 8 people or –47%) compared to March 2013. By origin, an increase was experienced by Canada (up 9 people). A decrease was experienced by US (down 17 people or -100%). Others remained at zero people.

#### **International Air**

Increases were experienced in air (up 447 people or +657%) compared to March 2013. By origin, increases were experienced by US (up 2 people or -657%), Canada (up 443 people or +1197%) and Others (up 2 people).

#### **Sameday Visit**

A total of 1,469 sameday visitors entered Yukon through Canada Border Services Agency's border crossings in March. Decreases were experienced in private vehicle (down 27 people or -2%), motorcoach (down 17 people), and air (down 3 people). By origin, decreases were experienced by US (down 27 people or -2%) and Others (down 20 people or -51%).

#### **Multiple Night Visit**

A total of 1,541 multiple night visitors entered Yukon through Canada Border Services Agency's border crossings in March. An increase was experienced in air (up 7 people). A decrease was experienced in private vehicle (down 177 people or –11%). Motorcoach remained at zero people. By origin, decreases were experienced by US (down 146 people or –9%) and Others (down 24 people or –25%).

## Port of Entry—Year to Date

Year to date (January to March) increases were experienced at Pleasant (up 33 people or +2%) and Whitehorse airport (up 429 people or +438%). Decreases were experienced at Beaver Creek (down 233 people or -6%), Fraser (down 529 people or -11%), and Dawson City (down 8 people or -4%). Little Gold was closed.
