# Year-to-date vs. 5 Year Average


# International Overnight Visitation (1+ Nights)

First quarter (Q1) overnight visitation for international visitors is 6% lower (-300 people) than the same period in 2018.

The month of March though saw an increase of 20% in overnight visitation compared to the 5 year average (2014-2019).

Q1 overnight visitation is 12% higher than the 5 year average.


#### Air Arrivals at Erik Neilson Whitehorse International Airport

Q1 air arrivals have grown by 16% or 6,100 more passengers than in 2018.

Over the last 5 years, air arrivals have grown by 33% or 11,200 more passengers than in 2015.

First quarter performance is 28% higher than the 5 year average (2014 to 2018).

## Occupancy at Select Fixed Roof Accommodation


Q1 occupancy is 0.8 points higher than the same period in 2018.

In the first three months of 2019, Yukon's occupancy rates are 2.8 points lower than national rate (56.6%).




Q1 border crossings are 4% higher than in 2018.


#### Same Day International Border Crossings (Into Yukon)


#### Retail Sales (Total Sales \$000)
