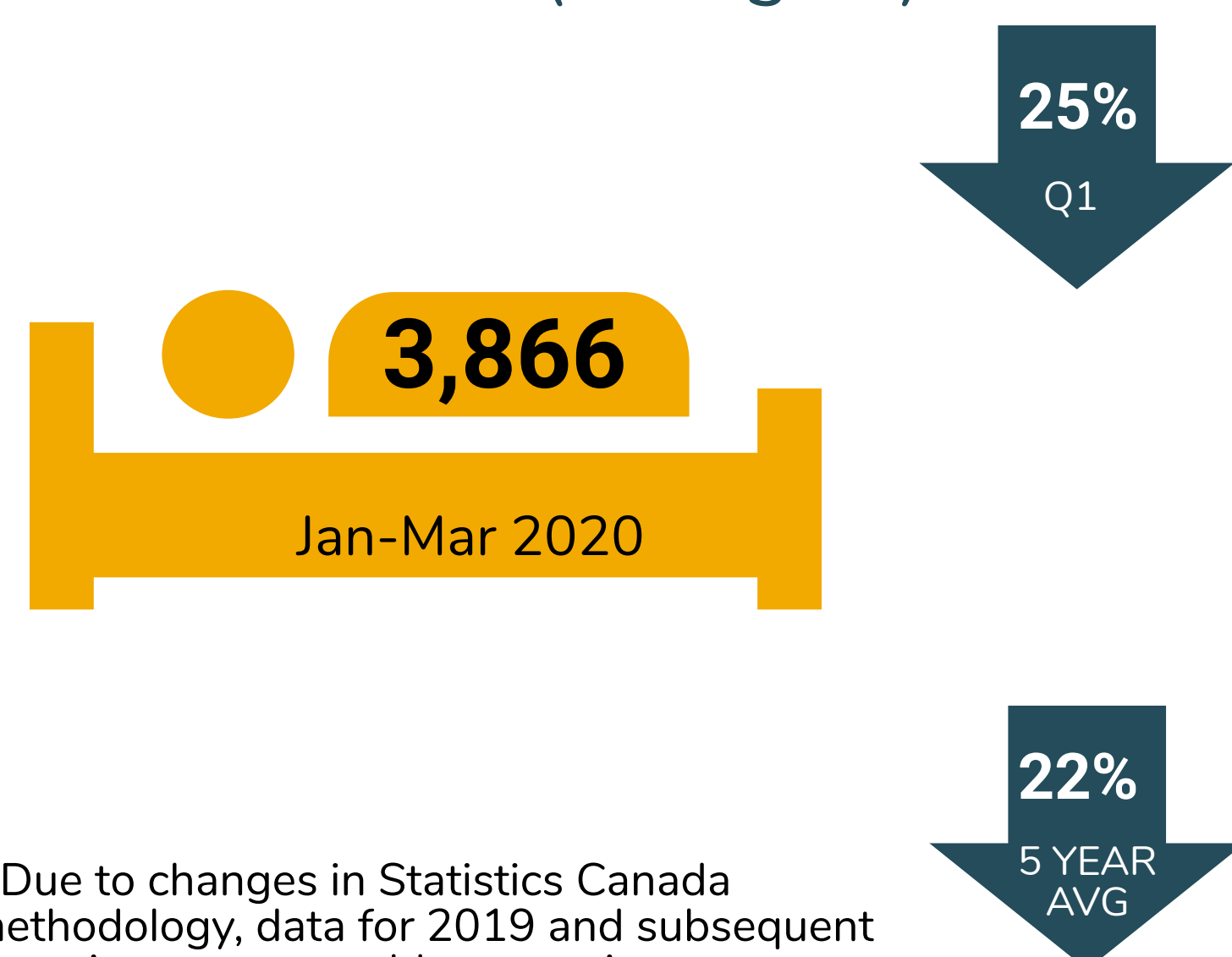


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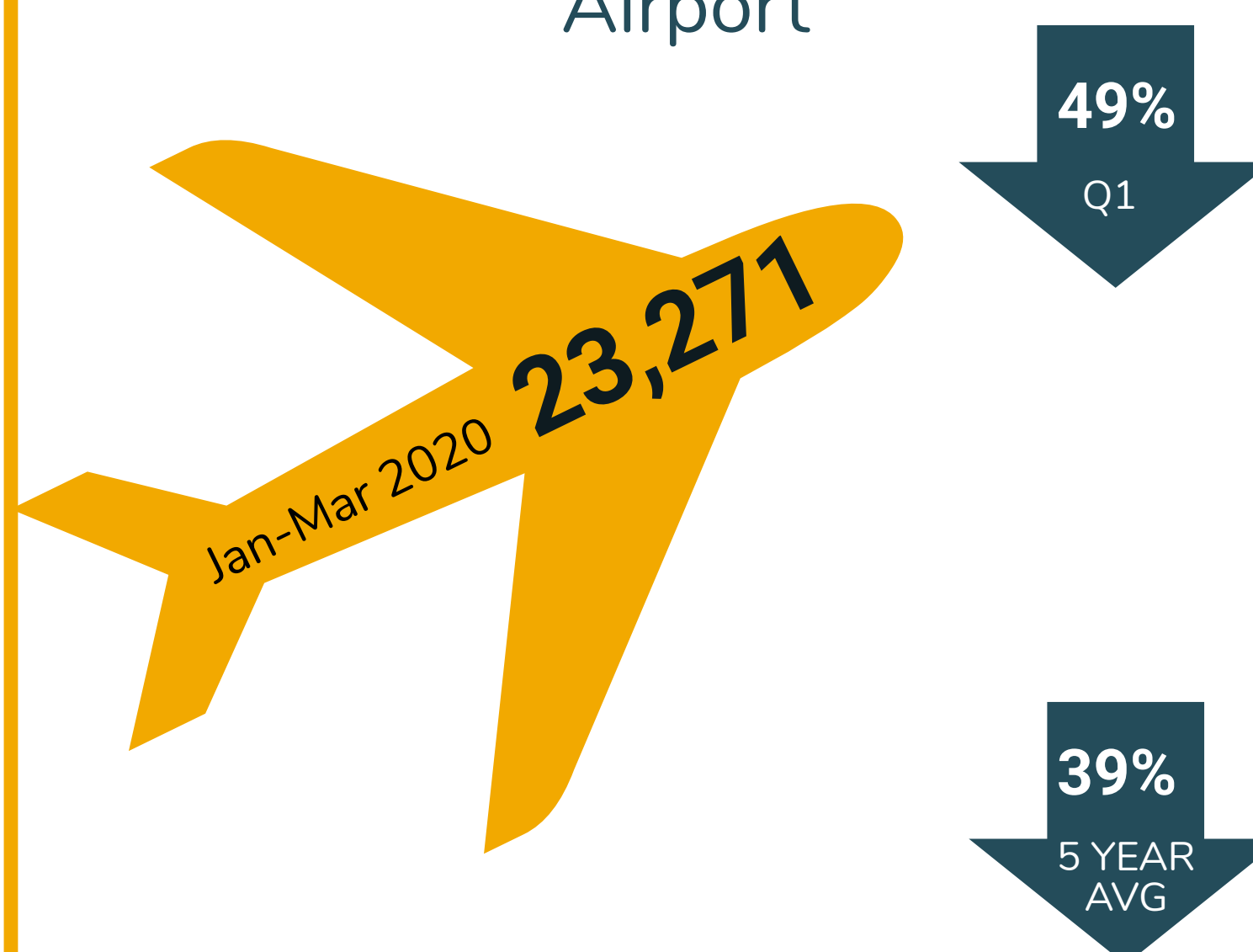

International overnight visitation (1+ nights)*

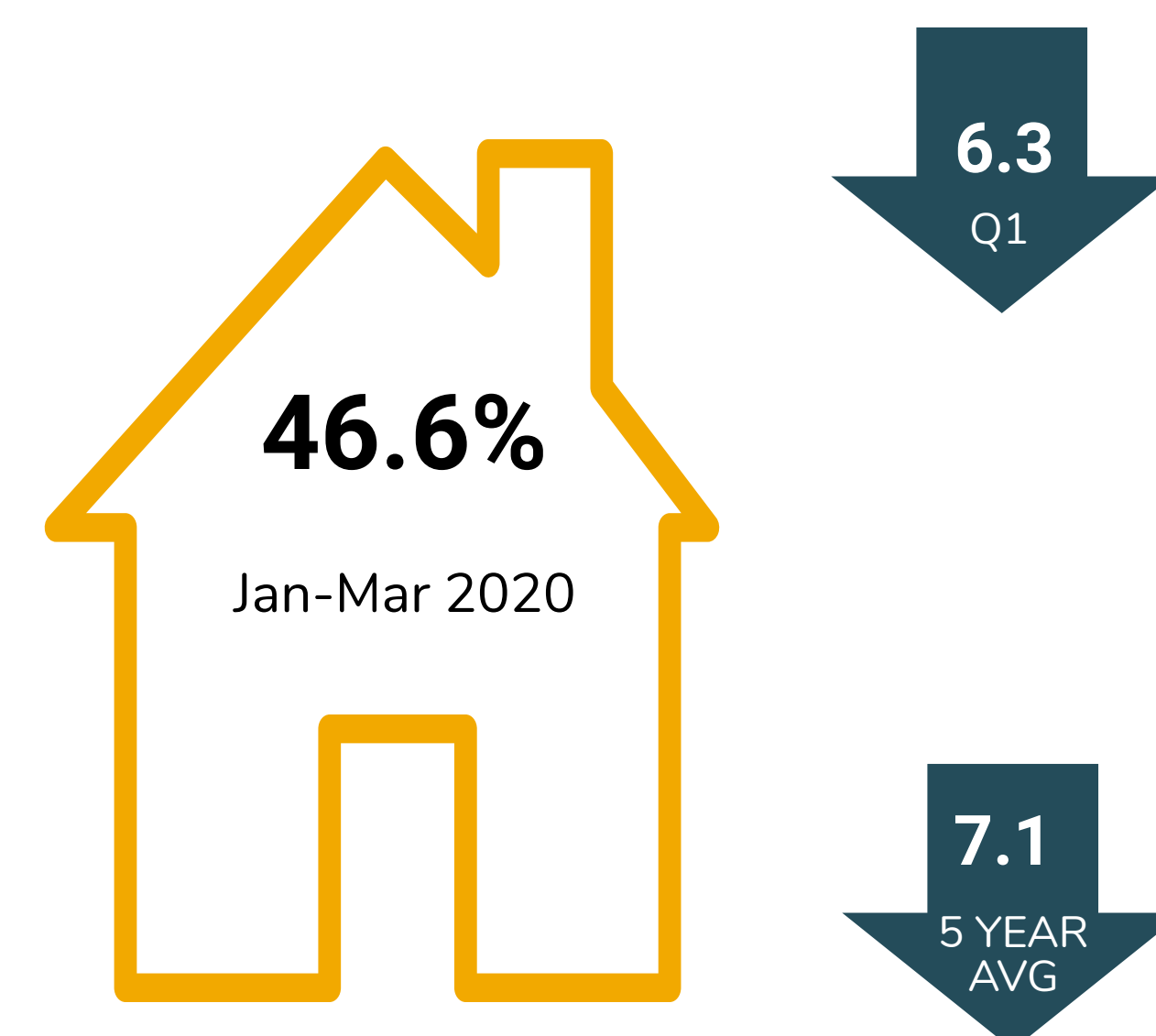

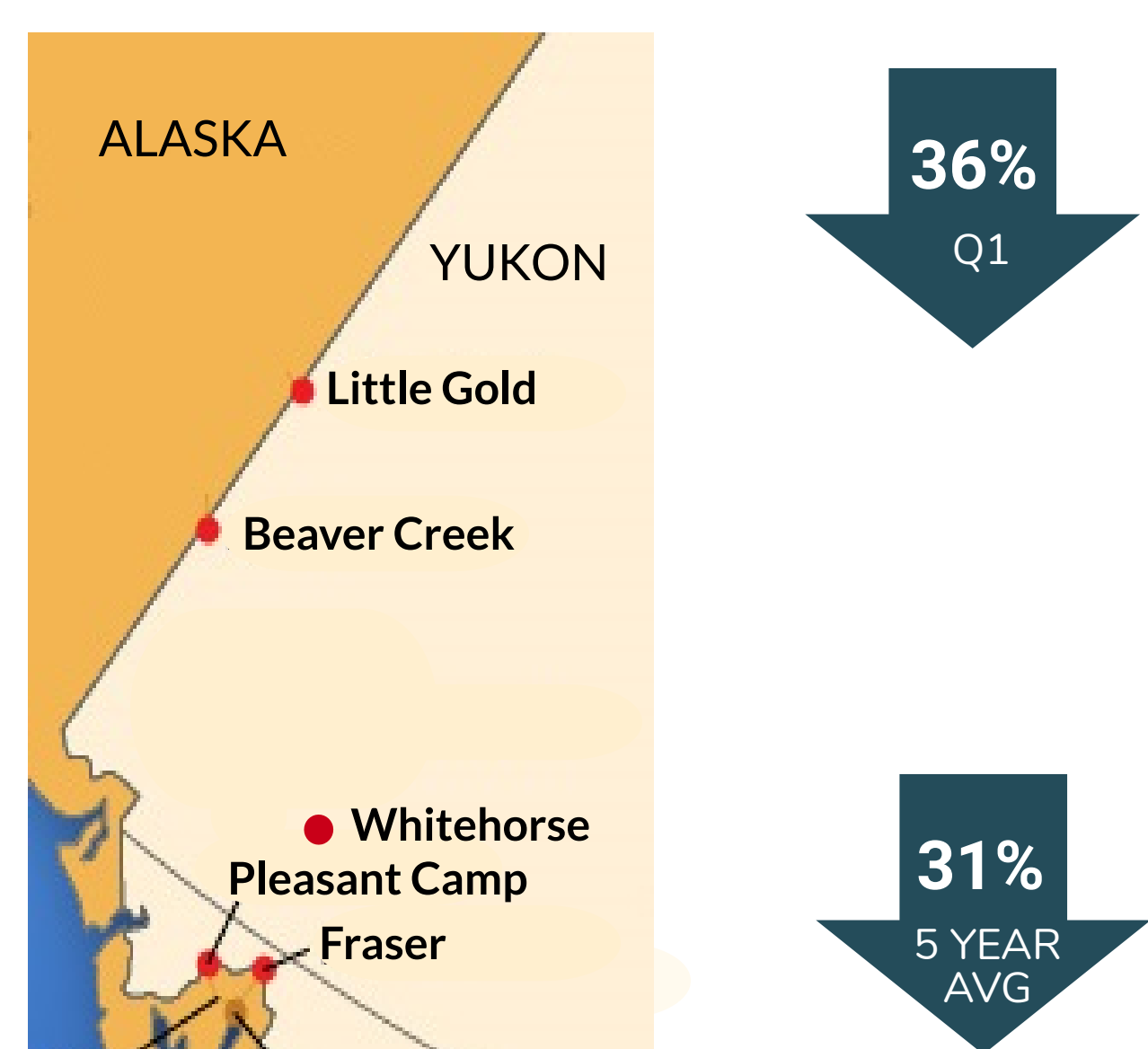
Air arrivals at Erik Nielsen Whitehorse International Airport



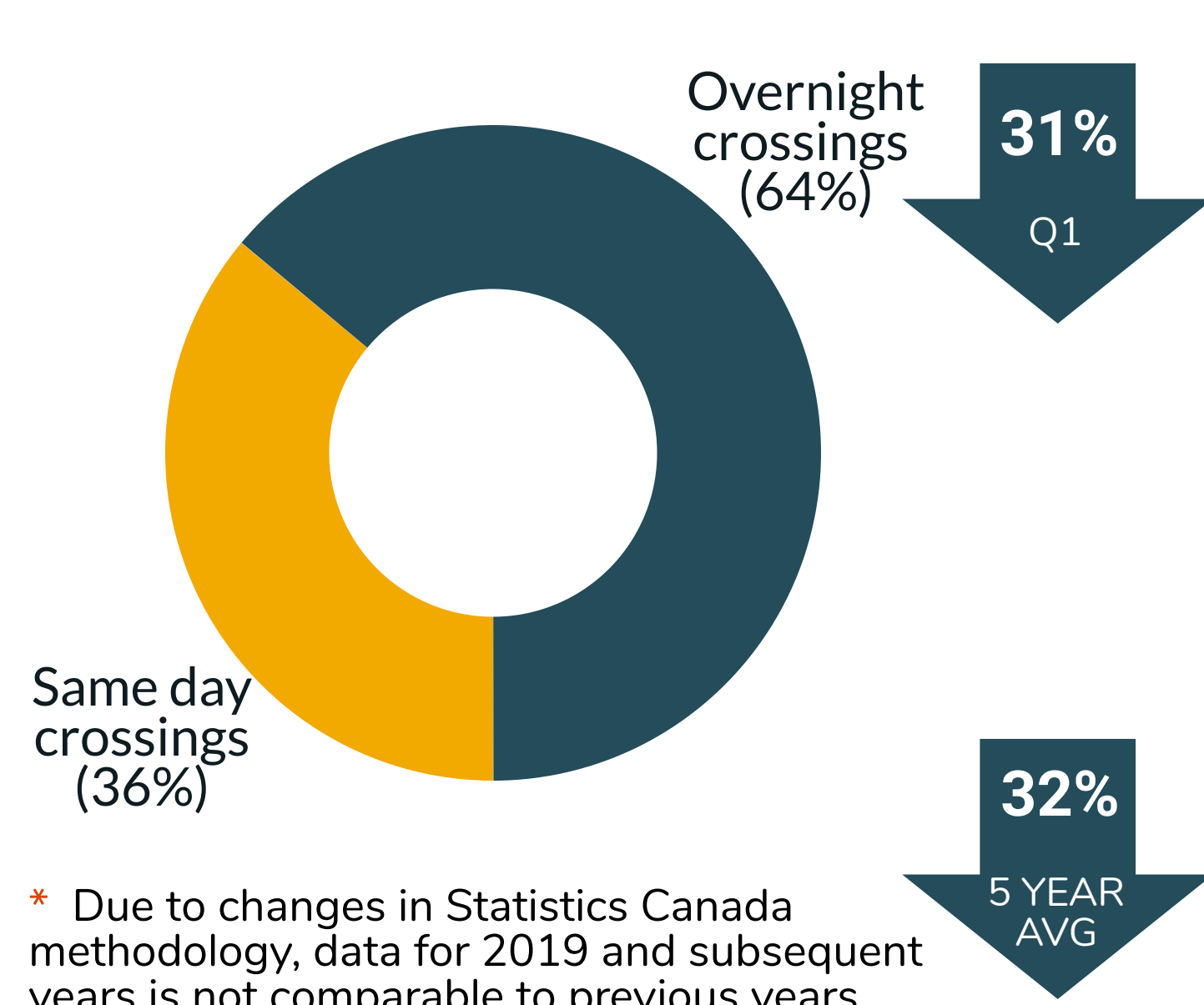
Occupancy at select fixed roof accommodations



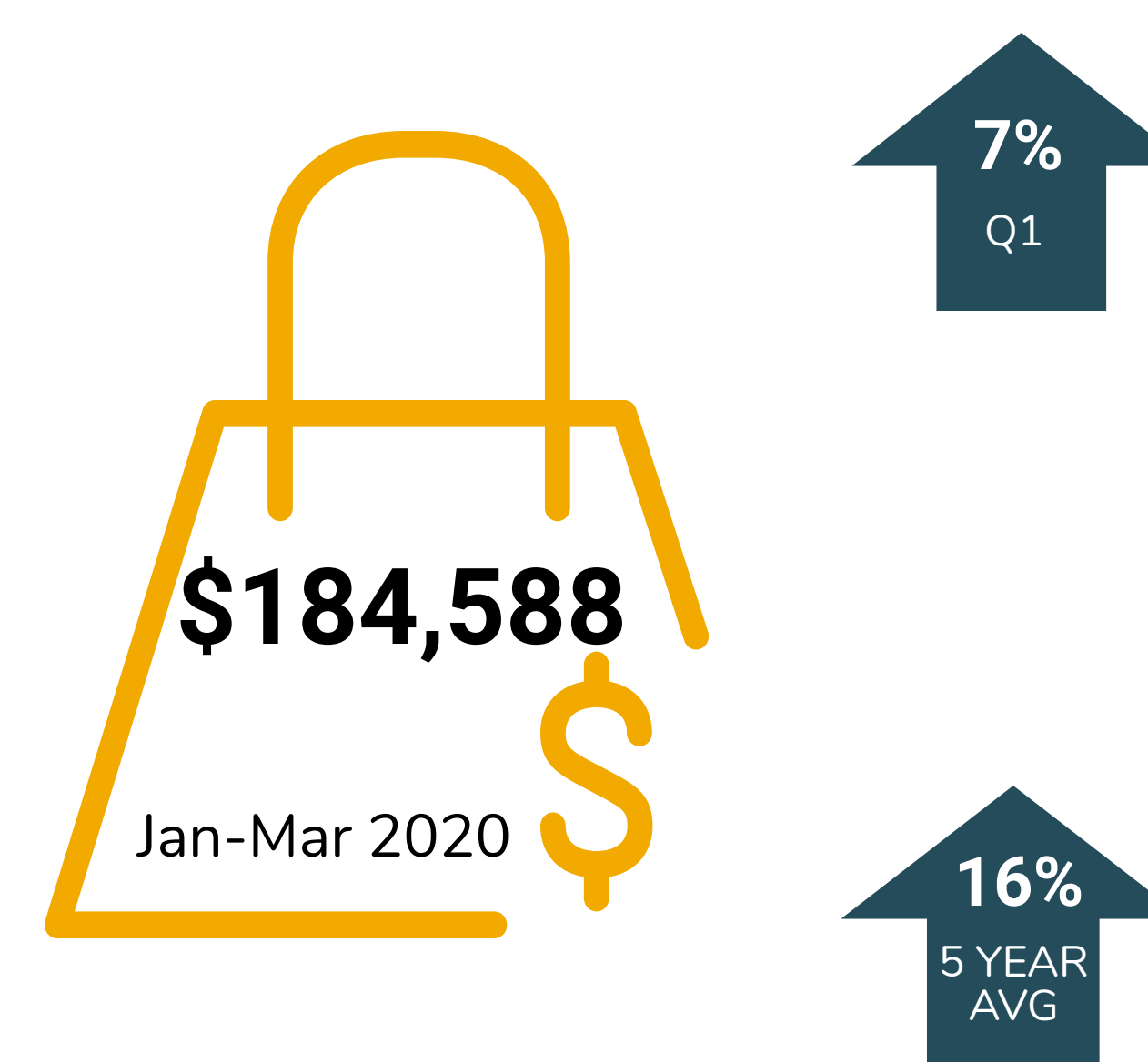
International border crossings (into Yukon)



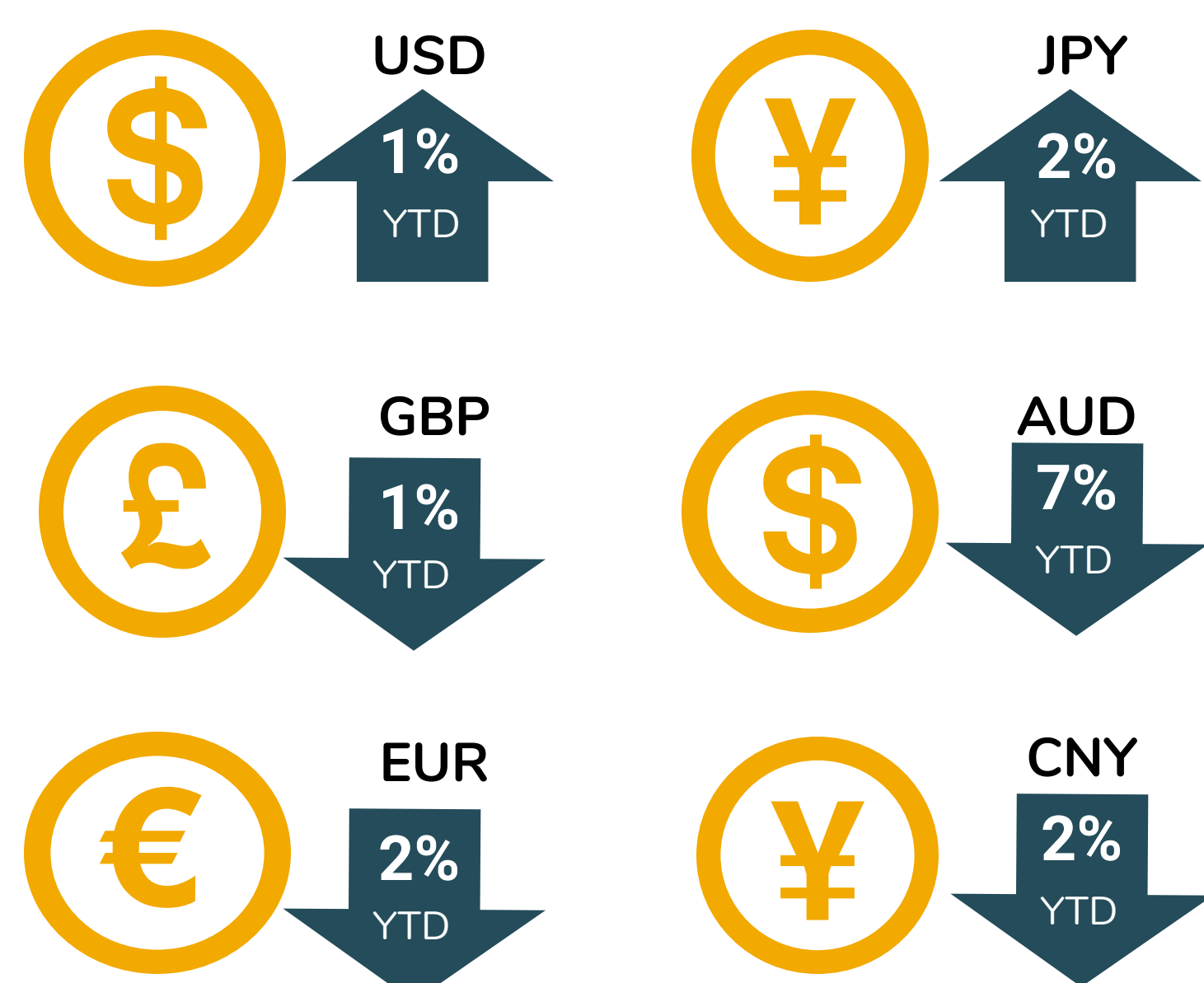
Same day international border crossings (into Yukon)*



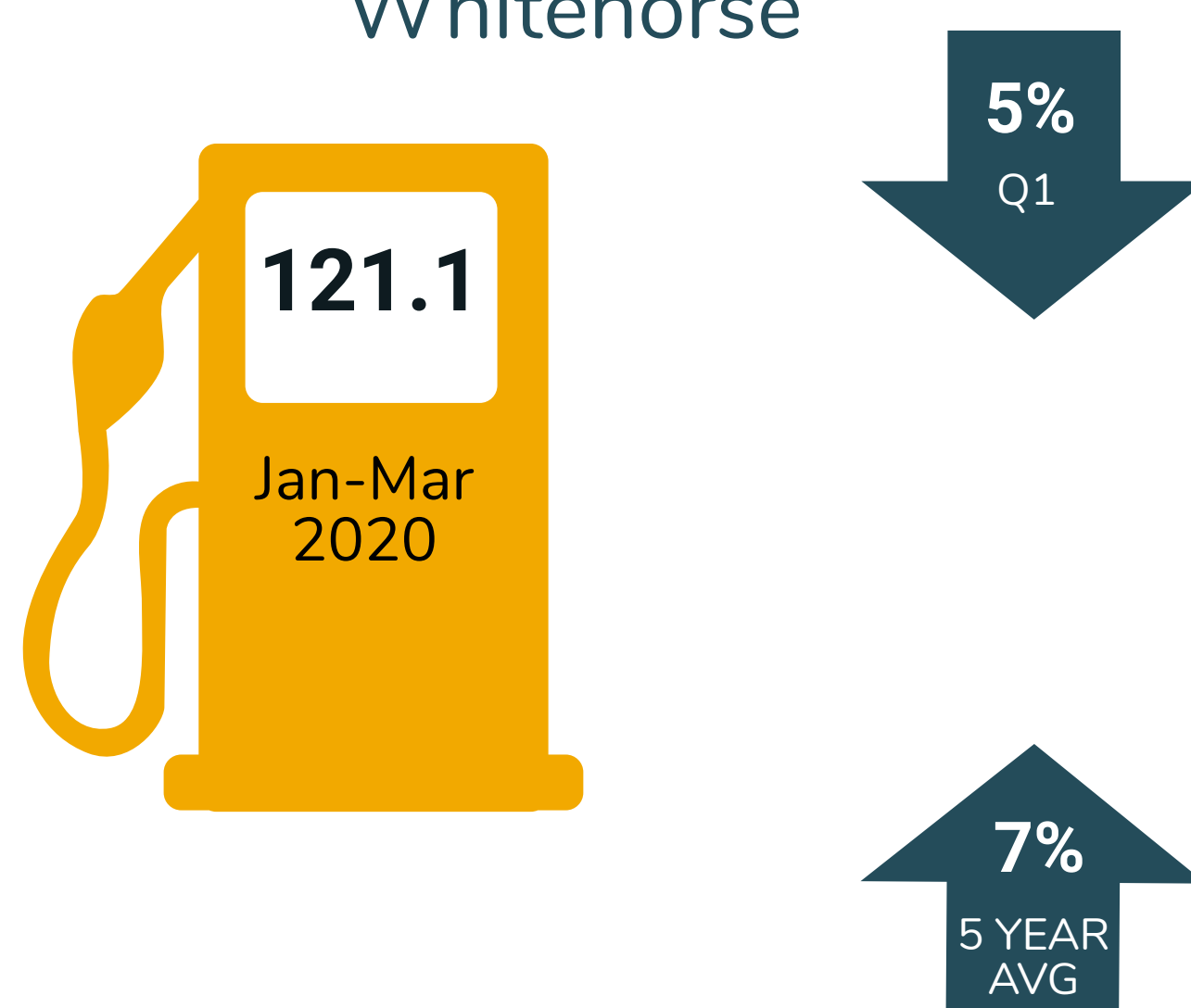
Retail sales (\$000)

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Year-to-date vs. 5-year average

International overnight visitation (1+ nights)*

First quarter (Q1) overnight visitation for international visitors was 25% lower (-1,300 people) than the same period in 2019.

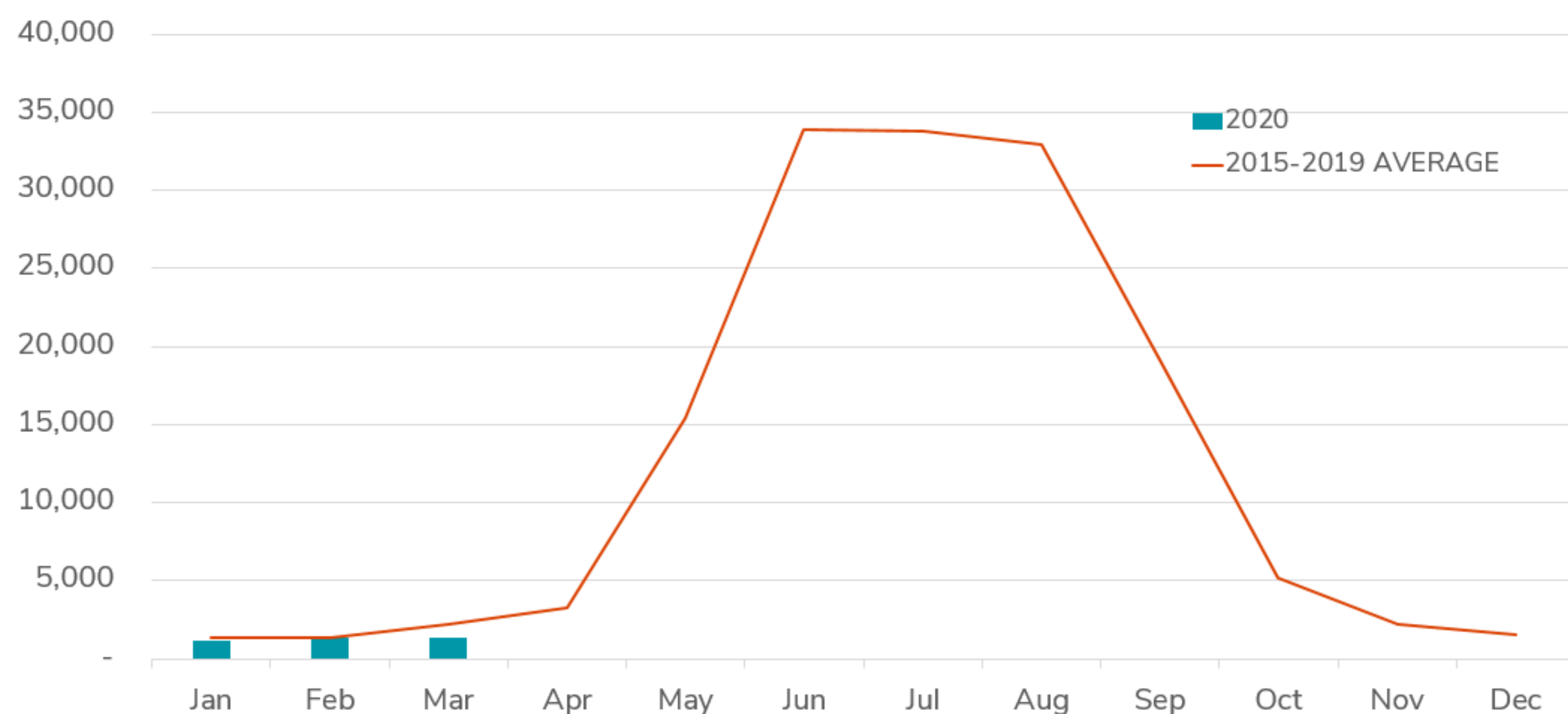
The month of March saw a decrease of 39% in overnight visitation compared to the 5-year average (2015-2019).

Q1 overnight visitation was 22% lower than the 5-year average.

Air arrivals at Erik Nielsen Whitehorse International Airport

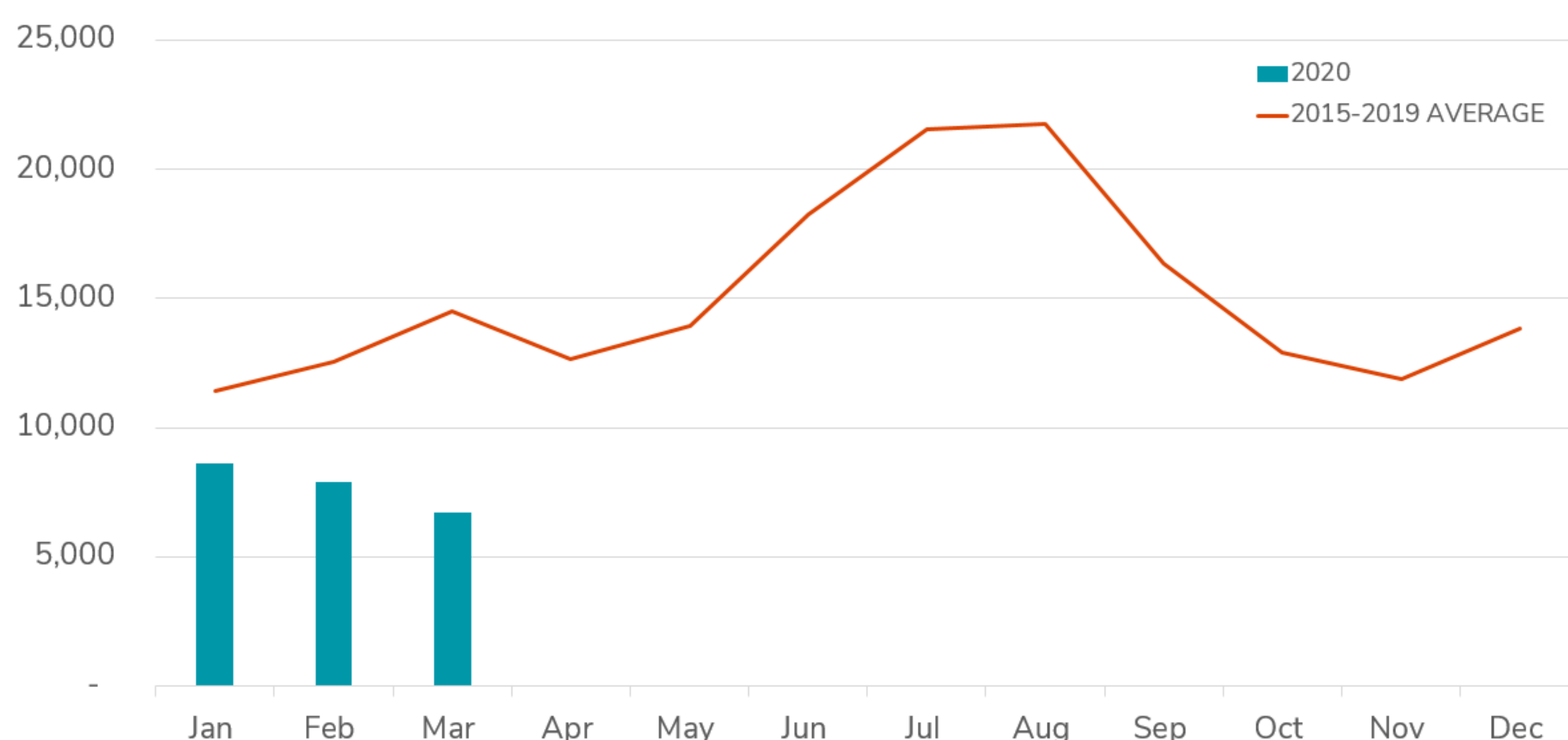
Q1 air arrivals have fallen by 49% or 22,000 fewer passengers compared to 2019.

Over the last 5 years, air arrivals have fallen by 36% or 13,400 fewer passengers compared to 2016.

First quarter performance was 39% lower than the 5-year average (2015 to 2019).

Occupancy at select fixed roof accommodations ii

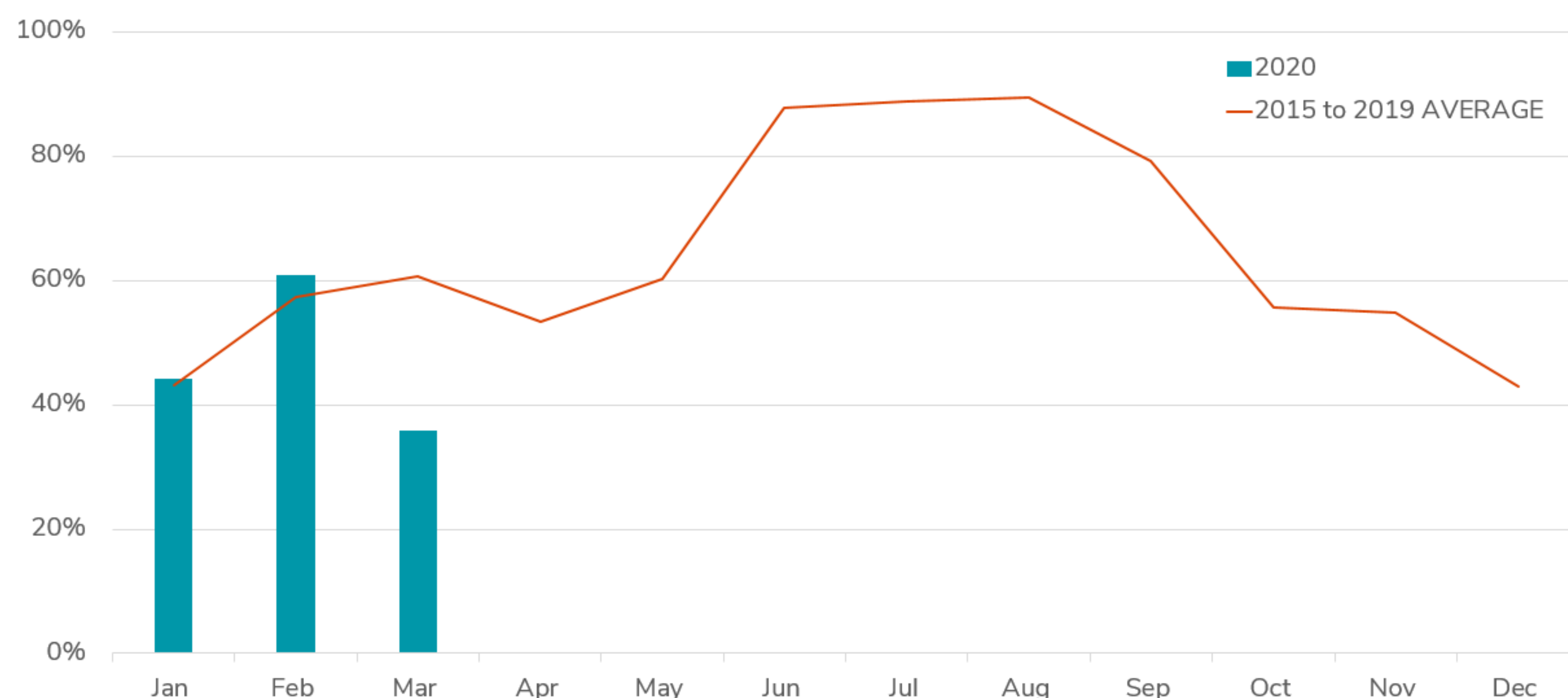
Q1 occupancy was 6.3 points lower than the same period in 2019.

In the first three months of 2020, Yukon's occupancy rates were 0.3 points lower than national rate (46.9%).

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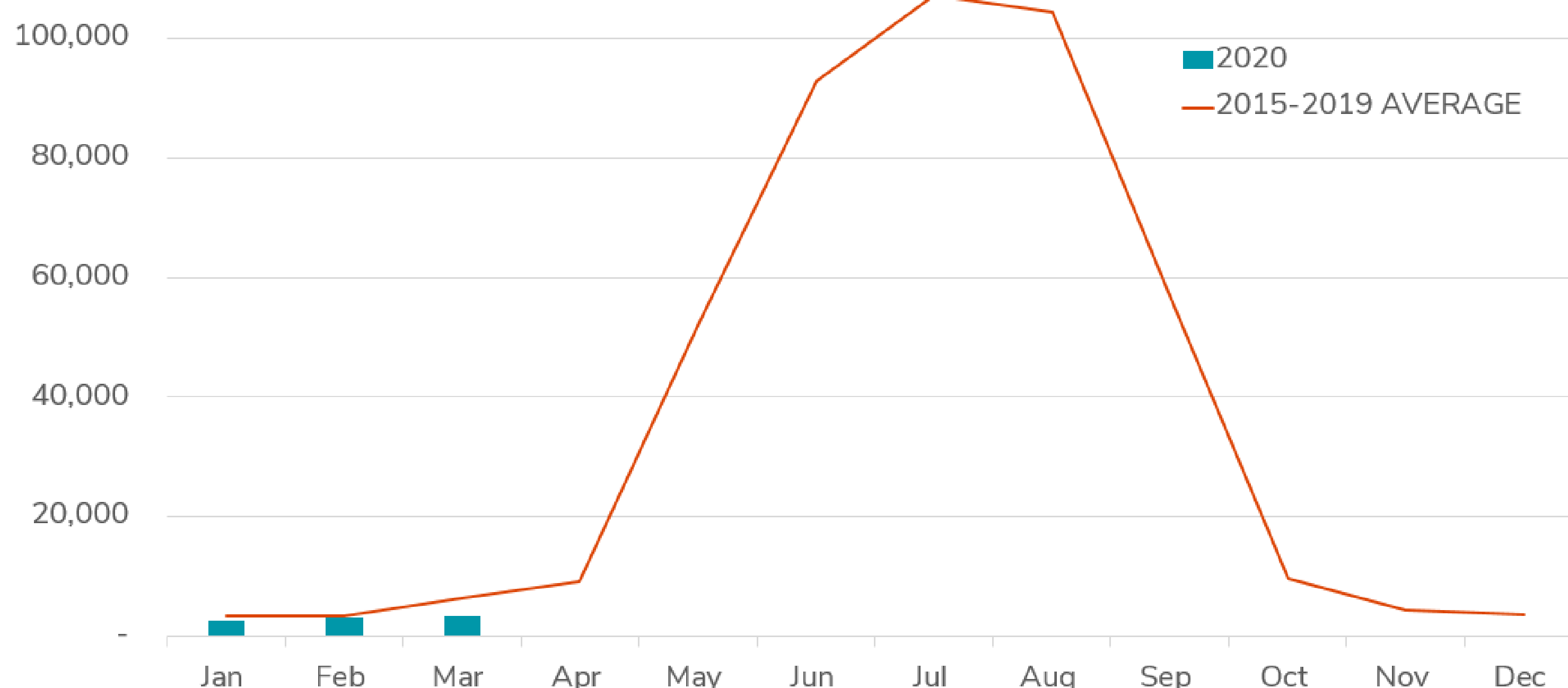
International border crossings (into Yukon)

Same day international border crossings (into Yukon)*

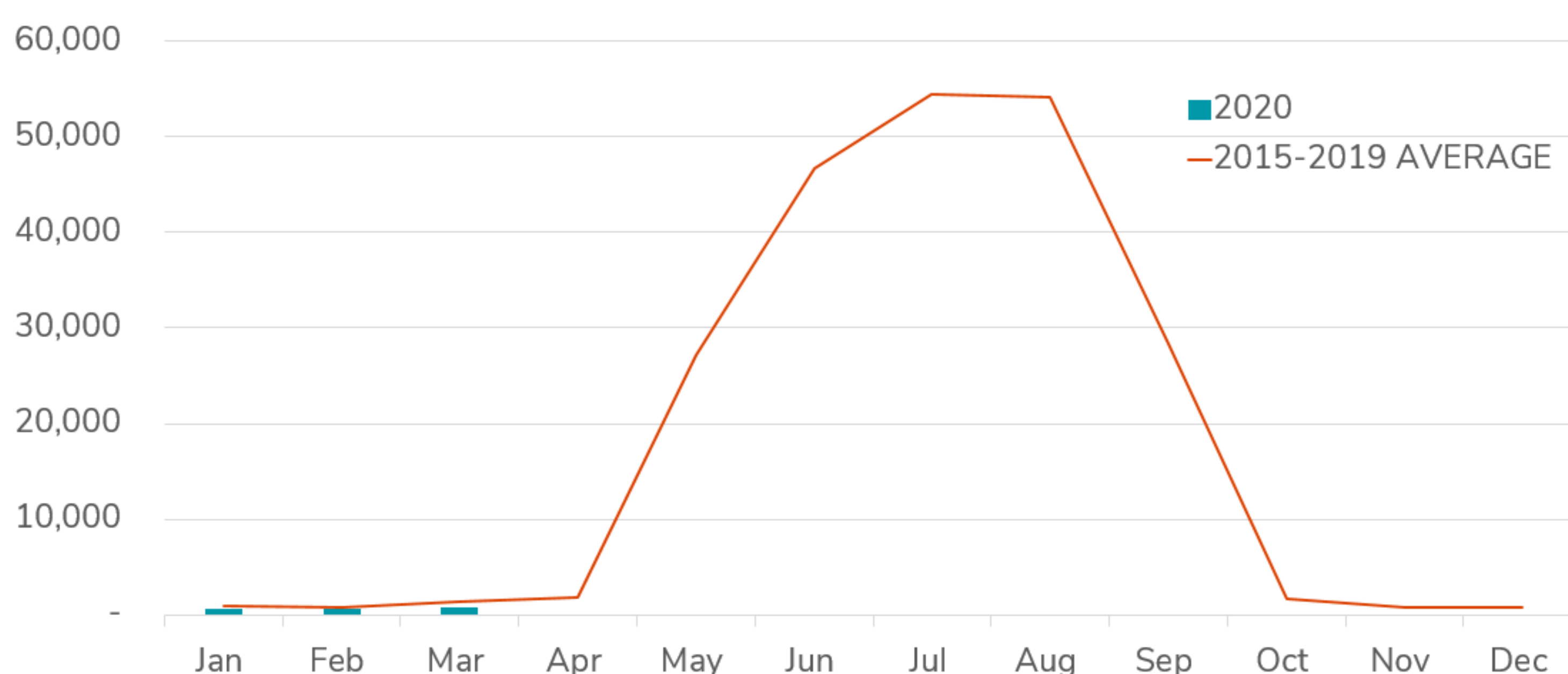
Q1 same day border crossings were 31% lower than in 2019.

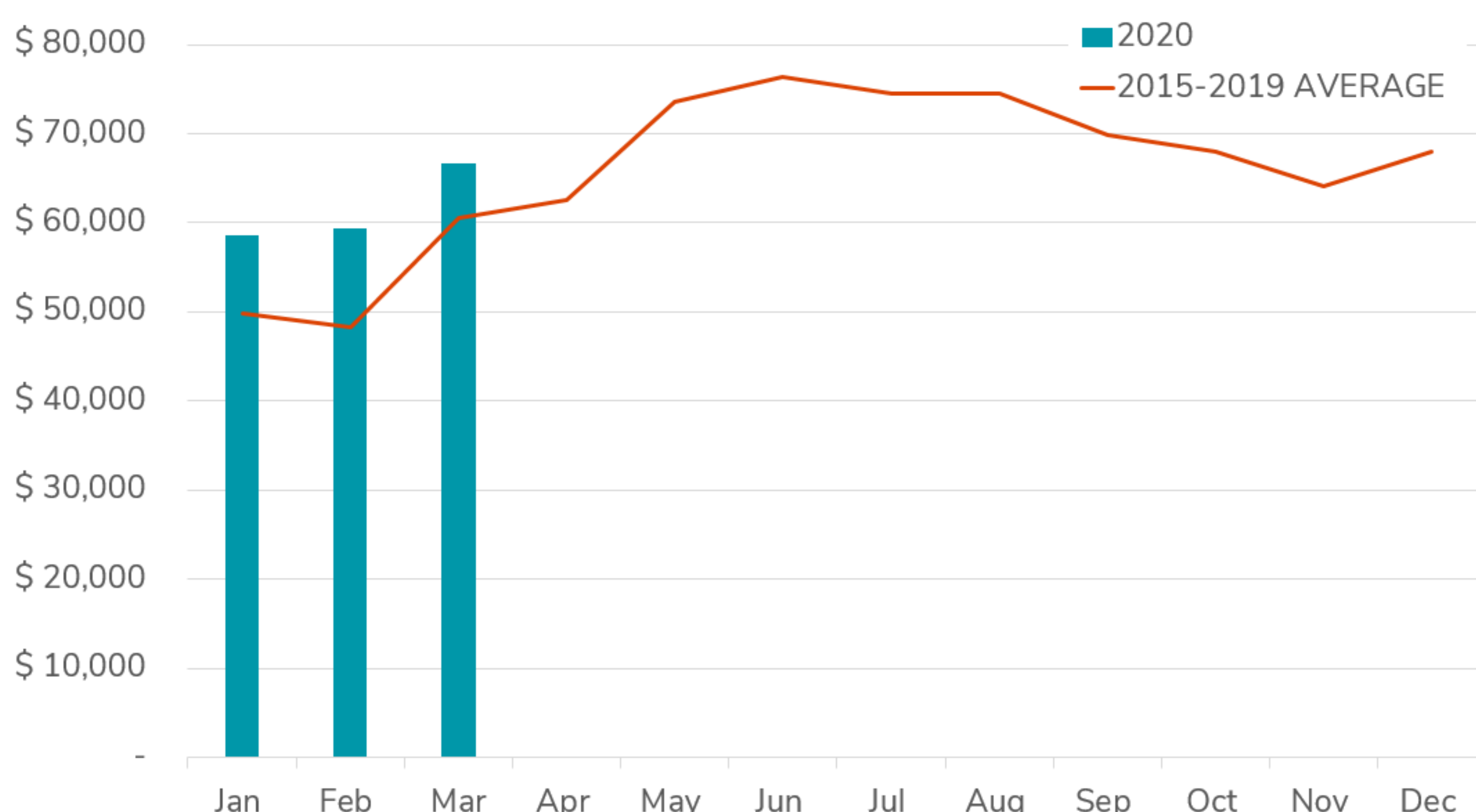
Retail sales (\$000)
