










# Year-to-date vs. 5-year average


### International overnight visitation (1+ nights)\*

Year-to-date (YTD), overnight visitation for international visitors was 19% higher than the same period in 2020.

Overnight visitation in Q4 of 2021 increased by 36% as compared to last year.

Overnight visitation in the fourth quarter of 2021 was 41% lower than the 5-year fourth quarter average. Source: Statistics Canada, Table 24-10-0043-01. American and overseas visitors only, no Canadian visitors are included.

### Air arrivals at Erik Nielsen Whitehorse International Airport


YTD air arrivals rose 52% over 2020.

YTD occupancy was 6 percentage point higher as compared to 2020.


The quarterly average growth for Q4 is 16.7 per cent as compared to 2020

### International border crossings (into Yukon)


YTD international border crossings were 8% higher than in 2020.

### Same day international border crossings (into Yukon)\*


YTD, same day border crossings were 5% higher than in 2020.


### Retail sales (\$000)
