An estimated 433,300 people visited Yukon from January to November 2014. This represents a decrease of 10,400 people or -2% compared to the same period last year.


One of the key measures used to estimate total visitation to Yukon was unavailable for the months of October and November. As a result, forecasts were used. Therefore, as updated data becomes available, total visitation figures will be revised.

The Yukon Visitor Tracking Program (YVTP) is a volumetric model that estimates the number of people that visit Yukon on a monthly basis. The model includes visitors entering Yukon via highway, train, and air; the model does not include Yukon residents.

A total of 3,792 people entered Yukon through Canada Border Services Agency's border crossings in November. This represents an increase of 559 people or +17% compared to November 2013.


A total of 3,792 people entered Yukon through Canada Border Services Agency's border crossings in November. This represents an increase of 559 people or +17% compared to November 2013. An increase was experienced in private vehicles (up 597 or +19%). Decreases were experienced in motorcoach (down 11 people or -42%) and air (down 27 people). By origin, an increase was experienced by US (up 365 people or +16%) and Canada (up 196 people or +21%), while a decrease was experienced for Others (down 2 people or -3%).

Private Vehicle

Increases were experienced in private vehicle (up 597 people or +19%) compared to November 2013. By origin, increases was experienced by US (up 392 people or +18%) and Canada (up 207 people, or +23%), while Others decreased (down 2 people or -3%).

Private Vehicle: automobile, cycle, and pedestrian.

Motorcoach

Decreases were experienced in motorcoach (down 11 people or -42%) compared to November 2013. By origin, decreases were experienced by US (down 11 people or -42%).

International Air

In November 2014 there were no border crossings by international air. Compared to November 2013, this amounted to a decrease of 27 people.

Sameday Visit

A total of 800 sameday visitors entered Yukon through Canada Border Services Agency's border crossings in November. An increase was experienced in private vehicles (up 233 people or +41%). A decrease was experienced in air (down 3 people).

Multiple Night Visit

A total of 1,854 multiple night visitors entered Yukon through Canada Border Services Agency's border crossings in November. All of this increase was experienced in private vehicle (up 157 people or +9%). By origin, an increase was experienced by US (up 145 people or +9%), while Others decreased (down 12 people or -20%).

Compared to November 2013, increases in border crossings were experienced at Beaver Creek (up 241 people or +15%), Fraser (up 138 people or +15%), and Pleasant (up 207 people or +31%). Decreases were experienced at the Whitehorse airport (down 25 people or -100%).

Port of Entry—Year to Date

Year to date (January to November), total border crossings were down 9,260 people, or -3%. Decreases were experienced at Beaver Creek (down 2,418 people or -4%), Fraser (down 14,997 people or -6%), Little Gold (down 5,064 people or -29%) and Old Crow airport (down 14 people). These decreases were partially offset by increases at Pleasant (up 3,475 people or +14%), Dawson City airport (up 8,941 people or +3,605%) and Whitehorse airport (up 846 people or +20%).
