
An estimated 9,000 people visited Yukon in January 2014. This represents a decrease of 700 people or +9% compared to January, 2013.

The Yukon Visitor Tracking Program (YVTP) is a volumetric model that estimates the number of people that visit Yukon on a monthly basis. The model includes visitors entering Yukon via highway, train, and air; the model does not include Yukon residents.

## **January Border Crossings**

A total of 2,594 people entered Yukon through Canada Border Services Agency's border crossings in January. This represents an increase of 104 people or +4% compared to January, 2013.



#### Total—January

A total of 2,594 people entered Yukon through Canada Border Services Agency's border crossings in January. This represents an increase of 104 people or +4% compared to January, 2013. An increase was experienced in private vehicle (up 176 people or +7%). Decreases were experienced in motorcoach (down 54 people or -100%) and in air (down 18 people or -90%). By origin, increases were experienced for US (up 80 people or +5%) and Canada (up 26 people or +3%). A decrease was experienced for Others (down 2 people or -6%).

#### **Private Vehicle**

An increase was experienced in private vehicle (up 176 people or +7%) compared to January 2013. By origin, an increase was experienced by US (up 97 people or +6%) and Canada (up 81 people or 11%). A decrease was experienced by US (down 2 people or -6%).

Private Vehicle: automobile, cycle, and pedestrian.

#### Motorcoach

Decreases were experienced in motorcoach (down 54 people or -100%) compared to January 2013. By origin, decreases were experienced by US (down 15 people or -100%) and Canada (down 39 people or -100%). Others remained at zero people.

#### **International Air**

A decrease was experienced in air (down 18 people or – 90%) compared to January 2013. By origin, decreases were experienced by US (down 2 people or –50%) and Canada (down 16 people).

### **Sameday Visit**

A total of 762 sameday visitors entered Yukon through Canada Border Services Agency's border crossings in January. An increase was experienced in private vehicle (up 5 people or +1%). A decrease was experienced in motorcoach (down 15 people). By origin, an increase was experienced by Others (up 6 people) and a decrease was experienced by US (down 16 people or -2%).

#### **Multiple Night Visit**

A total of 998 multiple night visitors entered Yukon through Canada Border Services Agency's border crossings in January. An increase was experienced in private vehicle (up 90 people or +10%). A decrease was experienced in air (down 2 people or –50%). By origin, an increase was experienced by US (up 96 people or +11%). A decrease was experienced by Others (down 8 people or –24%).
