### Art and artists supported by Yukon government

WHITEHORSE—Three Yukon government arts funding programs are providing \$124,615 to Yukon artists.

"The Yukon government is proud to support the ongoing development of Yukon artists," Minister of Tourism and Culture Elaine Taylor said. "The role and inherent value of the arts is central to the creation of a balanced and thriving society. Allowing artists the opportunity to learn, grow and expand their talents is essential for a healthy, creative and inspiring platform for new works to emerge."

Nine recipients of the Yukon government's Advanced Artist Award will share \$40,353, while nine projects will share \$73,160 through Yukon's Arts Fund and eight artists will receive support under Yukon's Touring Artist Fund totaling \$11,102.

Advanced Artist Award funding recipient Meg Walker will use the funding for her drawings, which incorporate soundscapes created by her drawing action and the outdoor environment. "The Advanced Artist Award will allow me to take the next step in crystallizing the experiments I've been doing to explore interactions between drawings and sound," Walker said. "The grant provides me the opportunity to work with a mentor to sharpen my skills in recording and editing sound, and then I will also have time to apply that new knowledge to a series of outdoor drawings. I'm excited to continue the creative discussions with my fellow Yukon artists, and I'm honoured that the community has chosen to support me in this tangible way."

The Five Fingers Collective is receiving \$8,500 from the Arts Fund for their Five Finger Rapids visual story. The collective works will result in 15 pieces to be exhibited in Whitehorse, Carmacks and Pelly Crossing, following extensive archival and on-site research of the Five Finger Rapids area during the summer months.

"We are very pleased to receive funding for this collaborative project," ceramic artist Lynne Sofiak said. "With a ceramic artist, a painter and a fibre artist in the collective, we expect to tell a compelling visual story about Five Finger Rapids and we look forward to sharing it with Yukoners and visitors."

The Touring Artist Fund will help wood carvers Benjamin Gribben and Brian James Francis attend the Great Northern Arts Festival in Inuvik.

"I'm happy to receive the funding," Francis said. "It's a great opportunity to go to Inuvik to take part in the festival. Those of us in attendance will be attending workshops and learning new art forms while there. We'll also have two days to work with other artists and learn from them."

"It was a goal of mine to be able to attend the festival and I think it will open up doors in my art career," Gribben said. I thank the people who believed in me all these years and never gave up on me, Northern Cultural Expressions Society and Tourism and Culture for helping me, and seeing my strengths."

The department of Tourism and Culture contributes more than \$2.7 million annually in support of arts and culture.
