Community Development Fund pitches in for softball

WHITEHORSE—Yukon government's Community Development Fund (CDF) is contributing over \$857,000 toward a variety of community projects, including sport and recreation, in the latest Tier 2 intake.

"The quality of projects is a testament to the dedication and commitment of Yukoners to enhancing their communities," Economic Development Minister Steve Nordick said. "An outstanding amount of community work is being done to improve the quality of life for Yukoners and we are pleased to support these initiatives."

Softball Yukon is one of the successful applicants, receiving \$75,000 to build a second storey on its utility building and upgrade existing plumbing and electrical service.

"The Senior Women's Fast Pitch World Championships are coming to Whitehorse in 2012 and we need to make these necessary upgrades to comply with championship regulations," Softball Yukon executive director George Arcand said. "Our building is also 30 years old so it's time for better and more economical utilities.

"Softball has been a thriving sport throughout Yukon and the CDF will also help us to create a space to display the history of the sport of softball in Yukon."

The Mayo Community Club is another successful applicant, receiving \$48,297 for extensive improvements to the community ball diamond.

"For some time now our ball diamond has become unusable due to drainage problems and overall deterioration," Mayo Community Club secretary-treasurer Ian Spencer said. "With these problems fixed, we can continue with our annual Canada Day invitational tournament and create more interest in the community.

"We plan to use some volunteers to help with the work, including a contractor on the Mayo B hydro project that will be donating some of its equipment and time doing earth moving for us, and we are grateful for this help."

The Community Development Fund offers three funding levels. Tier 1 is available for requests up to \$20,000. Tier 2 is available for applicants requesting \$20,001 to \$75,000 and Tier 3 is available for requests over \$75,000.

The next intake deadline for Tier 2 projects is September 15. Organizations are strongly encouraged to contact Community Development Advisors well before the deadlines for assistance with their applications and to develop project ideas. Backgrounder: Tier 2 Community Development Fund Recipients

Beaver Creek Community Club - \$55,353 - To replace and bring to code the community centre's entrance and exit areas and to repair the gymnasium roof to prevent ongoing water damage. The project will create 350 hours of employment for three people. **Contact**: Patti Cross at 867-862-7277

Great Northern Ski Society - \$67,500 - To hire Doppelmayr Canada Inc. to conduct necessary reconnaissance and engineering work related to the design, purchase and installation of a new chairlift for summer and winter activities at Mt. Sima. **Contact**: Craig Hougen at 867-668-4557

This is the 2nd stage of a three-stage project that will utilize the information gathered within the community to develop a new concept of the community-based early childhood education program.
