STATISTICS

Yukon Ambulance Services provides emergency transportation for residents and non-residents throughout the Territory. In Whitehorse, the ambulance station ares staffed 24 hours a day by ground and air ambulance practitioners. In communities, services are provided by on-call volunteers with two, full-time Primary Care Paramedics supplimenting weekday coverage in Dawson City and Watson Lake. Each community provides its volunteers and Yukon government provides the ambulances,
