



# PROTECTIVE SERVICES Emergency Medical Services Ambulance Services

#### **STATISTICS**

Yukon Ambulance Services provides emergency transportation for residents and non-residents throughout the Territory. In Whitehorse, the ambulance station are staffed 24 hours a day by ground and air ambulance practitioners. In communities, services are provided by on-call volunteers with two, full-time Primary Care Paramedics supplementing weekday coverage in Dawson City and Watson Lake. Each community provides its volunteers and Yukon government provides the ambulances, equipment and training.
