Yukon Talent Will Take to the Stage at 2010 Olympic and Paralympic Winter Games

WHITEHORSE – Yukon kicks off Yukon Culture at 2010 with today's announcement of the upcoming visual performances, art exhibitions and traditional sport demonstrations that will showcase Yukon at the Vancouver 2010 Winter Olympic and Paralympic Games.

"The 2010 Winter Olympics will give Yukon artists and performers an unprecedented opportunity to showcase their talents before a worldwide audience," Tourism and Culture Minister Elaine Taylor said. "We are especially proud that support for programs like Culture Quest has helped strengthen Yukon's tourism, investment and creative opportunities aimed at growing Yukon's art and culture sectors."

"The Yukon Arts Centre is pleased that Yukon Culture at 2010 coordinator Michele Emslie and her team have taken on the challenge of showcasing Yukon's diverse talent at the upcoming Vancouver 2010 Winter Games," said Al Cushing, CEO Yukon Arts Centre. "The team has brought together an incredible cast to represent Yukon at celebration sites across the greater-Vancouver area."

The creative components and their team leaders are:

- Yukon Culture at 2010 coordinator Michele Emslie and assistant Andrea Burgoyne.
- Yukon Victory Celebration artistic director Celia McBride, working with Vancouver producer Patrick Roberge.
- Sewing Our Traditions: Dolls of Canada's North, Mary Bradshaw and Jennifer Bowen,

Many of Yukon's cultural activities are in partnership with the Yukon First Nation 2010 Project led by the Council of Yukon First Nations working with the Four Host First Nations, and Yukon is also working closely with Nunavut and Northwest Territories to create a pan-northern experience. Traditional Inuit and Dene Games athletes will do demonstrations at various venues throughout the Olympic Games.

Yukon's investment of \$2.6 million for the games is aimed at showcasing Yukon as a visitor destination; promoting Yukon as a great place to invest and do business; celebrating Yukon First Nations culture; exposing Yukon artists and performers to the world and engaging youth and sport development.
