Recreational Infrastructure Projects Receive CDF Funding

WHITEHORSE – The Community Development Fund (CDF) has awarded \$192,437 to 14 community projects that qualify for Tier 1 funding.

"The funding provided for these projects represents Yukon government's commitment to creating a better quality of life for all Yukoners," Economic Development Minister Jim Kenyon said. "Sports and recreational pursuits, along with supporting infrastructure, are essential in keeping our communities healthy. These projects certainly add to that important part of our lives."

The Village of Carmacks has been awarded \$19,150 to upgrade the community's all-terrain vehicle trails.

"The upgrades we are doing are all about making the trails safe and enjoyable for users," Village of Carmacks chief administrative officer Cory Bellmore said. "Trails will be widened, some barriers will be put in place to keep riders away from unsafe areas and everyone will be able to obtain a GPS map of the trails at the village office. The CDF has given us so much support over the years. We have a great relationship with the staff and the projects have really made a difference in our community."

The Polarettes and Polar Tumblers Gymnastics Club of Whitehorse is another successful applicant, receiving \$19,348 to increase the useable floor space of their gym.

"The CDF funding will go towards enhancing the use of the upper mezzanine by adding a set of stairs for ease of public access, building a pony wall to allow viewing from above, adding a wall to control public access to the gym floor and equipment as well as providing funding for structural engineering design work," Polarettes board member Kimberley Henney said. "Once this work has been completed we will have a great viewing area for parents as well as general use space for our members.

"The functional change of the mezzanine will increase the gym floor area allowing us to easily incorporate a new piece of equipment, a tumble track, without changing the overall functionality of the gym. The tumble track, used by both recreational and competitive gymnasts, will help to increase their gymnastic skills and abilities thereby increasing their overall success and enjoyment of the sport," Henney added.

The Community Development Fund offers three funding levels: Tier 1 funding is available for requests up to \$20,000; Tier 2 funding is available for requests of \$20,001 to \$75,000; and Tier 3 funding is available for requests over \$75,000. The next intake deadline is January 15, 2010 for Tier 1 and 3 applications.
