Touring Artist Fund Sends Yukon Artists Across Canada

WHITEHORSE – Tourism and Culture Minister Elaine Taylor announced the Touring Artist Fund is contributing \$46,340 to enable seven projects featuring music, visual artists and dancers to tour Canada.

"The Yukon government values the role that the arts play in Yukon society and are pleased to support a wide range of programs in support of Yukon artists such as through the Touring Artist Fund," Taylor said.

Hungry Hill, Yukon's well known contemporary acoustic bluegrass group, received \$8,665 in the last intake.

"The Touring Artist Fund puts Yukon artists on a more level playing field with artists elsewhere in Canada," Bob Hamilton of Hungry Hill said. "It's a valuable resource, and we're proud to have that in place."

Two other recipients, Breakdancing Yukon Society and First People's Performances, will have the opportunity to attend festivals where they will be able to engage with many similar artists, which is difficult within a smaller population.

The Touring Artist Fund fosters the development of the arts by supporting literary, visual and performing artists, ensembles and companies to present their work publicly at professionally curated national or international exhibitions, concerts, festivals, or showcases. Seven projects were adjudicated for the December 15 intake, with all seven receiving the total or near-total amount of their request.
